Letter from Eight Former Secretaries of State Supporting the U.S.-Peru Trade Promotion Agreement

We are writing to urge your support for swift approval of the U.S.-Peru Trade Promotion Agreement.

U.S.-Peru trade has doubled over the past three years, spurred by Congressional approval in 2002 of the Andean Trade Promotion and Drug Eradication Act.

With 28 million consumers, Peru is one of the fastest growing markets for U.S. exports. Peru is a strategic partner in America's efforts to foster growth in South America, eradicate narcotics trafficking, and combat terrorism.
