

## **Contraband Information for Training Academy Attendees**

"Training Academy Attendees" includes:

- Class participants
- Instructors

Items listed in this section

must not be brought onto the facility. If you have

these items, you must leave them in your car.

 Anyone visiting the Academy

## Contraband is defined as:

Any item prohibited from offender possession within a facility or program because it endangers the safety and security of the institution, staff or offender, and/or members of the community. Contraband also includes items an offender is prohibited from obtaining because of treatment issues.

## Supplying Contraband is a Felony

(per ORS 162.185):

A person commits the crime of supplying contraband, if the person knowingly introduces any contraband into an OYA facility or program; or a person confined in such facility or program knowingly makes, obtains, or possesses any contraband item. The OYA will initiate criminal charges against any person committing such a crime.

## **Examples of Contraband include:**

- Aerosol spray cans or soda cans
- After-shave lotion or any toiletries containing alcohol
- Alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs
- Cell phones and other electronic communication devices
- Cigarette lighters or matches
- Cleaning products or other caustic chemicals
- Clothing articles with obscene wording, gang colors or gang insignia
- Clove cigarettes
- Explosives/firecrackers
- Firearms, defense sprays or knives
- Paint thinner, lighter fluid, gasoline or glue
- Pornographic materials
- Tobacco, cigarettes, cigars or smoking pipes
- Tattooing devices
- Metal, glass or wood objects that may be used as weapons or for escape such as:
  - Baseball bats
- Needles
- Large combs

- Brass knuckles
- Razor blades
- Tools (any type)

- Ceramics/pottery
- Screwdrivers
- Screws/nails

- Glass bottles
- Sharp metal objects
- Wire, cord or rope
- Other items designated by facility or program

Training Academy attendees may possess the following items on their person but *must* keep them out of the hands of the youth offenders:

Gum
