# Juvenile Justice Information System Vision & Goals

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## Introduction

When the Oregon Legislature created the Oregon Youth Authority in 1995, it required that the juvenile justice community adopt a recidivism definition and statewide reporting system as a way to assess progress of juvenile crime reduction and prevention efforts. This report is published in response to that mandate.

### **Definition of recidivism for this report:**

*“As a measure of public safety, recidivism is defined as a new criminal referral.*

*A criminal referral is a law enforcement report to a juvenile department alleging one or more felony or misdemeanor acts (offenses).”*

## Contents of this report

This report contains statewide and county-specific measures of recidivism for 2006 based on the measurement of criminal activity as a gauge of community safety. The report selects youth that had a criminal referral in 2006 and tracks them for the following 12 months. In order to track all youth who had a referral in 2006 for a full 12-month period, the report requires 2006 referral data to be complete.

## Notes about the information

Counts: Data is grouped by the county where the referral originated. The report counts the total number of youth that had a criminal referral originating in that county in the reporting year. The report sorts the results into two primary groups:

- **No Subsequent Referrals** – youth that had no subsequent referrals during the following 12 months; and
- **Subsequent Referrals** – youth that had one or more subsequent referrals during the following 12 months. This group is further divided into two groups:
  - youth with 1-2 Subsequent Referrals;
  - youth with 3 or more Subsequent Referrals.

Comparison to Year End Referral Reports: Referral counts for these reports are based on felony and misdemeanor criminal referrals in 2006 and subsequent felony and misdemeanor criminal referrals during the following 12 months. The year end Youth and Referral reports also include non-criminal violation referrals. After controlling for criminal referrals only, the referral counts

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may be slightly different from the 2006 Referral reports because new data entry may have occurred since publication of the 2006 Referral reports.

Percentages: Percentages may not add up to 100% because of rounding.

Race and Ethnicity: The JJIS Steering Committee defined Age and Race/Ethnicity reporting categories based on best practices and available data. Race and Ethnicity may be as recorded by the juvenile department based on police reports and youths' self-reporting. These reports categorize youth by the race that is recorded in JJIS unless the recorded ethnicity is Hispanic. When the recorded Ethnicity is Hispanic, the youth is categorized as Hispanic, regardless of recorded Race.

#### Findings and Analysis

- Total statewide offenders in 2006 are 17,597.
- The statewide recidivism rate is 31.0%
- The statewide chronic recidivism rate is 6.2%.

Further analysis of the year end recidivism data, longer tracking periods, and trends over time may be provided by the Oregon Youth Authority, the Oregon Juvenile Department Directors' Association, and local juvenile departments.

Cautions about the Data: Readers are cautioned against making gross comparisons between counties. Many factors can influence recidivism rates including the size of the county (small numbers can vary significantly), local laws and practices, and local law enforcement resources.

Further caution is advised with respect to comparing findings of this report to data from years prior to 2001. Early data was a compilation of independent data systems where youth could not be uniquely identified as they moved between counties. Not all counties were able to participate. Additionally, prior to 2001, recidivism was computed based on the total number of criminal "offenses" potentially inflating the chronic recidivism rates. This 2006 report includes data from all 36 counties and computes recidivism based on criminal referrals rather than total offenses, providing a more accurate indication of the chronic recidivism rate.
