

Facts:

- The unemployment rate for persons with severe mental illness is typically 85-90%
- In the US, the case management programs that provide supported employment typically have an employment rate of 40-50% of consumers enrolled in this evidence based practice.
- The six Oregon counties that provide supported employment and send OMHAS quarterly reports on employment data, typically have hit about a 45% employment rate! That is a 300-400% higher employment rate than obtained by persons with SMI not enrolled in supported employment.
- The employment that consumers are obtaining in supported employment in Oregon pays at least minimum wage, and is a job that any one could apply for (integrated setting). Also it is not necessary to use pre-employment activity such as day treatment to help these consumers obtain jobs in the community
- Each of these counties has a collaborative relationship between the mental health program and the local Office of Vocational Rehabilitation
- Supported employment is a billable code under the Oregon Health Plan
- The supported employment OHP code is only used by a handful of Oregon Counties.
