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Report Highlights:

This report analyzes China's calendar year 2004 agricultural, fishery, and forestry commodity trade using recently released data from China Customs. Calendar year imports were \$35 billion of which, \$8.1 billion originated from the United States. Imports consist primarily of soybeans, cotton, palm and soybean oils, and forestry products. China's agricultural, fishery, and forestry exports climbed to \$28 billion for the year, consisting primarily of processed aquatic and forestry commodities. This report updates information from CH4073, China's January to November trade. At the eight-digit HTS level, the first and second greatest by value import of any commodity from the U.S. are agricultural commodities: soybeans (\$3.3. billion) and cotton (\$1.8 billion).

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Executive Summary

This report provides greater insight and information concerning the kind and value of agricultural, fishery, and forestry products China imports, exports, and processes. This report updates information from GAIN report CH4073. Readers should be aware data will not exactly match other countries' export statistics due to the timing of exports (e.g. trade recorded in an exporting country at the end of one month or year might not be recorded in China's records until the following month or year). Furthermore, values from one country to another may vary due to disparity in recording methods (e.g. FOB vs. CIF/landed price). Also, inconsistencies may exist as a result of Hong Kong or Macau re-export trade to or from China. Finally, some inconsistencies may stem from the re-classification of goods between countries Customs officials.

Quick facts and observations from China Customs 2004 data detailed in this report:

- China Customs recorded January through December imports of all items from the world equaled \$560 billion, an increase of 36 percent. China's worldwide ag, fish, and forestry imports account for 6 percent of all Chinese imports.
- China Customs recorded January through December imports of all items from the United States equaled \$45 billion, an increase of 32 percent. Imports of United States ag, fish, and forestry commodities account for 18 percent.
- China Customs recorded \$8.1 billion in U.S. agricultural, fishery, and forestry commodity imports is greater than China's imports of all goods from 217 trading partners, including China's total imports from each of the following countries: India, France, Saudi Arabia, Canada, Indonesia, Italy, and the U.K.
- The first and second greatest by value of any Chinese imports from the United States at the Harmonized Tariff System (HTS) eight-digit level, see explanation below, are agricultural commodities:

China's calendar year 2004 agricultural, fishery, and forestry commodity imports surpassed \$35 billion while exports almost reached \$28 billion. In comparison to the previous year imports increased 40 percent and exports 14 percent. Bulk commodity imports, including wheat, cotton, soybeans, vegetable oils, and rubber increased the most. Aquatic and forestry commodity imports increased significantly, as well, but analysis indicates many of these imported goods were for processing and re-export.

The United States supplied over 23 percent of China's \$35 billion in agricultural, fishery, and forestry imports. The United States market share continues expanding. The next closest import providers in CY2004 were Brazil (9 percent), Argentina (8 percent), Malaysia (7 percent), Australia (7 percent), Russia (6 percent), and the EU-25 (5 percent).

The top agricultural, fishery, and forestry commodities at the HTS six-digit level from United States were soybeans, cotton, hides and skins, wheat, and food preparations. Prospects for American agricultural, fishery, and forestry commodity exports to China remain strong. However, many of China's trading partners are actively engaging the highest levels of leadership and exploring potential free trade agreements and market access provisions for their own agricultural commodities that may disadvantage the United States in the future.

(Note: China's imports of raw agricultural materials like cotton, hides and skins, and lumber are included in the import portion of this trade data. However, the processed materials like apparel and furniture are not included in the agricultural export statistics. Therefore determining whether China carries an agricultural, fishery, and forest product trade deficit is not a useful analytic exercise. Additional items to point out: HTS is the abbreviation for "Harmonized Tariff System." HTS is a system of harmonizing the worldwide trade of any commodity by assigning a unique code to each good. Presently, worldwide codes are harmonized at the two, four, and six-digit level. Eight- and ten-digit levels are more precise in their classification of goods, but not uniform across countries. "Not elsewhere specified or indicated" is abbreviated NESOI).
