## Oregon Senate Bill 1080 Major provisions and their effective dates

Electronic verification of Social Security numbers

Proof of U.S. citizenship or legal presence in the U.S.					
Collection of full legal name for driver record (on cards, names are shorted to 39-character limit)  Allow use of photo on file for customers who have already proven legal presence, SSN, and full legal name and who are out-of-state for renewal (such as military service members deployed abroad)		•			
Fee increase of \$1.50 per card <sup>3</sup>					
Allow 90-day temporary driving permit, with 60-day extension available, to give customers time to obtain required SSN and/or lawful presence documents					
Electronic verification of alien identification numbers					
Fee increase of \$1 per card					
Limited-term cards for people with limited stays in U.S.					
Electronic verification of other ID documents, such as birth certificates and passports					

## **Notes**

- 1. These requirements took effect Feb. 4, 2008, under administrative rules as a result of Governor's Executive Order 07-22.
- 2. The only electronic verification systems in existence today are for Social Security numbers and alien identification numbers. Systems for birth certificates and passports are in development.
- 3. This fee increase is in addition to a previously scheduled \$3 per-card fee increase to fund facial recognition under 2005 Oregon legislation.
