Louisiana Livestock Slaughter

Commercial red meat production in Louisiana during December totaled 500,000 pounds, down 17 percent from November and 29 percent from the previous year.

There were 500 head of **cattle** slaughtered during December, down 100 head from November and 200 head below the previous year. Average live weight was 770 pounds, down 28 pounds from the previous month and 96 pounds below December 2006. Total live weight, at 396,000 pounds, was down 14 percent from the previous month and 37 percent below the previous year.

<u>Calves</u> slaughtered during December totaled 200 head, down 200 head from November and 100 pounds below the previous year. Live weight averaged 503 pounds, up 3 pounds from November but 2 pounds below a year ago. Total live weight, at 93,000 pounds, was down 50 percent from November and 38 percent below the previous year.

The number of <u>hogs</u> slaughtered during December totaled 2,000 head, up 300 head from the previous month but 200 head below December 2006. Average live weight was 158 pounds, down 25 pounds from November but 2 pounds above the previous year. Total live weight was 318,000 pounds, up 4 percent from November but 7 percent below a year ago.

The number of <u>sheep</u> slaughtered during December was 300 head, up 100 head from November and the previous year. Live weight averaged 68 pounds, down 8 pounds from the previous month and 1 pound below the previous year.

United States Livestock Slaughter

Commercial red meat production for the United States totaled 4.1 billion pounds in December, up 5 percent from the 3.9 billion pounds produced in December 2006.

December 2007 contained 21 weekdays (including one holiday) and 5 Saturdays. **December 2006** contained 21 weekdays (including one holiday) and 5 Saturdays.

Beef production, at 2.1 billion pounds, was slightly above the previous year. Cattle slaughter totaled 2.7 million head, up 1 percent from December 2006. The average live weight was up 2 pounds from the previous year, at 1,302 pounds.

Veal production totaled 10.4 million pounds, 21 percent below December a year ago. Calf slaughter totaled 61,000 head, down 11 percent from December 2006. The average live weight was down 35 pounds from last year, at 289 pounds.

Pork production totaled 2.0 billion pounds, up 10 percent from the previous year. Hog kill totaled 9.7 million head, up 9 percent from December 2006. The average live weight was up 1 pound from the previous year, at 272 pounds.

Lamb and mutton production, at 15.4 million pounds, was down 1 percent from December 2006. Sheep slaughter totaled 229,100 head, 1 percent above last year. The average live weight was 135 pounds, down 1 pound from December a year ago.

January to December 2007 commercial red meat production was 49 billion pounds, up 2 percent from 2006. Accumulated beef production was up 1 percent from last year, veal was down 6 percent, pork was up 4 percent from last year, and lamb and mutton production was down 1 percent.

Louisiana Cattle Inventory

All cattle and calves on Louisiana farms as of January 1, 2008, were estimated at 890,000 head, up 3 percent from a year ago. All cows that have calved were estimated at 540,000 head, up 4 percent from a year ago. Louisiana's 2007 calf crop was estimated at 425,000 head, up 2 percent from the 2006 calf crop.

- ▶ **Beef cows** were estimated at 513,000 head, up 5 percent from January 1, 2007.
- ▶ Milk cows, at 27,000 head, were down 10 percent from a year ago.

Other cattle inventory estimates and changes from a year ago were:

- **Beef cow replacement heifers** − 90,000 head, up 5 percent.
- ► Milk cow replacement heifers 8,000 head, down 11 percent.
- ► Other heifers 20,000 head, up 11 percent.
- ► Steers 500 pounds and over 23,000 head, up 10 percent.
- **Bulls 500 pounds and over** − 34,000 head, up 3 percent.
- ► Calves under 500 pounds 175,000 head, up 5 percent.

United States Cattle Inventory

All cattle and calves in the United States as of January 1, 2008, totaled 96.7 million head, slightly below the 97 million on January 1, 2007. All cows and heifers that have calved, at 41.8 million, were down 1 percent from the 42 million on January 1, 2007.

- ▶ **Beef cows**, at 32.6 million, were down 1 percent from January 1, 2007.
- ▶ Milk cows, at 9.2 million, were up 1 percent from January 1, 2007.

Other class estimates on January 1, 2008, and the change from January 1, 2007, are as follows:

- ► All heifers 500 pounds and over, 20 million, down slightly.
- ▶ **Beef replacement heifers**, 5.7 million, down 4 percent.
- ► Milk replacement heifers, 4.5 million, up 3 percent.
- ▶ **Other heifers**, 9.9 million, down slightly.
- ► Steers weighing 500 pounds and over, 17.3 million, up slightly.
- **Bulls** weighing 500 pounds and over, 2.2 million, down slightly.
- ► Calves under 500 pounds, 15.4 million, down 1 percent.
- ► Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter in all feedlots, 14.3 million, up slightly.
- The combined total of **calves under 500 pounds**, and other heifers and steers over 500 pounds outside of feedlots was 28.2 million, down slightly.

The 2007 **calf crop** was estimated at 37.4 million head, down slightly from 2006. Calves born during the first half of the year are estimated at 27.2 million, down 1 percent from 2006.

January Farm Prices Received Index Up

The preliminary All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers in January, at 150 percent, based on 1990-92=100, increased 6 points from December. The Crop Index was up 16 points but the Livestock Index decreased 4 points. The January All Farm Index and All Crop Index were record highs. Producers received higher commodity prices for corn, soybeans, broilers and wheat and lower prices were received for milk, tomatoes, hogs and turkeys. The overall index is also affected by the seasonal change based on a 3-year average mix of commodities producers sell. Increased average marketings of corn, soybeans, cattle and strawberries offset decreased marketings of grapes, milk, broilers and cottonseed.

The preliminary All Farm Products Index was up 27 points from January 2007. The Food Commodities Index, at 150, increased 2 points from last month and 26 points from January 2007.

Prices Paid Index Up

The January Index of Prices Paid for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Farm Wage Rates was 168 percent of the 1990-92 average. The index was up 3 points from December and 13 points above January 2007. This was a record high for the index. Higher prices in January for cash rent, taxes and other farm services more than offset the decline in diesel fuel, feeder cattle and hay & forages.

Louisiana Milk Production

Louisiana dairies produced 76 million pounds of milk during the October-December 2007 quarter, down 12 percent from the same period in 2006. Milk cows averaged 27,000 head during the quarter, down 3,000 head from last year.

United States Milk Production

Milk production in the U.S. during the October - December quarter totaled 46.0 billion pounds, up 3.2 percent from the October - December quarter last year. The average number of milk cows in the U.S. during the quarter was 9.2 million head, 80,000 head more than the same period last year.
