### **HIGHLIGHTS IN THIS REPORT**

Quarterly Milk Production

#### Louisiana Milk Production

Louisiana dairies produced an estimated 96 million pounds of milk during the January-March 2008 quarter, down 9 percent from the same period in 2007. The number of milk cows averaged 27,000 head during the quarter, down 10 percent from last year.



### **United States Milk Production**

Milk production in the U.S. during the January-March quarter totaled 47.6 billion pounds, up 3.2 percent from the January - March quarter last year. The average number of milk cows in the U.S. during the quarter was 9.3 million head, 112,000 head more than the same period last year.

Milk production in the 23 major states during March totaled 15.1 billion pounds, up 2.4 percent from March 2007. February revised production, at 13.9 billion pounds, was up 6.2 percent from February 2007. The February revision represented an increase of 23 million pounds or 0.2 percent from last month's preliminary production estimate.

Production per cow in the 23 major states averaged 1,795 pounds for March, 12 pounds above March 2007.

The number of milk cows on farms in the 23 major states was 8.4 million head, 141,000 head more than March 2007, and 9,000 head more than February 2008.
