### **Louisiana Crop Prospects**

Louisiana's 2007 harvest season has progressed well. Corn, rice and soybean yields have exceeded earlier expectations, and are expected to set new records. Cotton and sorghum yield prospects also continue to improve.

Louisiana's **corn** production is forecast at a record high 116.8 million bushels, up 7 percent from the previous month and up 188 percent from 2006. An estimated 730,000 acres will be harvested for grain, a 152 percent increase from a year ago. Yield per acre, at 160 bushels, is up 10 bushels from last month and surpasses by 12 bushels the record yield set in 2001.

**Soybean** production is expected to total 22.6 million bushels in Louisiana, up 5 percent from the August 1 estimate but down 23 percent from 2006. An estimated 580,000 acres will be harvested, down 31 percent from 2006. Yield is forecast at 39 bushels per acre, up 2 bushels from last month and up 4 bushels from last year's record yield.

Louisiana **rice** production is forecast at 22.4 million cwt, down 1 percent from the August 1 estimate but up 11 percent from 2006. Rice harvested acreage was revised to 373,000 acres, down 12,000 acres from the June 1 estimate. Yield per acre is forecast at a record 6,000 pounds, up 100 pounds from the previous month and 180 pounds from last year.

Louisiana's **cotton** production is expected to total 650,000 bales, down 591,000 bales from 2006. Acreage of cotton expected for harvest was revised to 325,000 acres, down 10,000 acres from the June 1 estimate. The expected yield per acre, at 960 pounds, is up 14 pounds from 2006. If realized, this will be the next highest yield in the state's history, second only to the 967 pound yield in 2003.

The Louisiana **sugarcane** crop is estimated at 12.2 million net tons, down 2 percent from the previous month but up 3 percent from the last year. Estimated production is down from last month as harvested acreage for sugar and seed was revised from 430,000 acres to 420,000 acres. Yield is forecast at 29 net tons per acre, unchanged from the August 1 estimate but up 1.7 net tons from 2006.

**Sorghum** production is estimated at 19.7 million bushels in the state, up 3 percent from the August 1 estimate and up 136 percent from 2006. Acreage to be harvested for grain is forecast at 205,000 acres, 118,000 acres more than last year.

Yield is forecast at 96 bushels per acre, up 3 bushels from last month but the same as last year.

### **United States Crop Prospects**

Corn production is forecast at 13.3 billion bushels, up 2 percent from last month and 26 percent above 2006. Based on conditions as of September 1, yields are expected to average 155.8 bushels per acre, up 3.0 bushels from August and up 6.7 bushels from last year. If realized, this would be the second highest yield on record, behind the 160.4 bushel yield in 2004. Production would be the largest on record as growers expect to harvest the most corn acres for grain since 1933. Expected yields are higher than August across the northern and central Great Plains and Corn Belt where heavy rainfall during the month provided much needed moisture for the crop. Yield forecasts in the southern Great Plains and Delta are also higher than last month as early harvest results are better than anticipated.

**Soybean** production is forecast at 2.62 billion bushels, down slightly from the August forecast and down 18 percent from last year's record high. Based on September 1 conditions, yields are expected to average 41.4 bushels per acre, down 0.1 bushel from August and down 1.3 bushels from last year. Compared with last month, yields are forecast lower across the central Corn Belt, the Tennessee Valley and the Southeast. Hot, dry conditions contributed to most of the decline, especially in Kentucky and Tennessee, down 8 bushels and 9 bushels from last month, respectively.

Rice production is forecast at 192 million cwt, up 1 percent from the August forecast but down 1 percent from last year. Based on administrative data, planted area was revised to 2.75 million acres, up slightly from the June estimate but down 3 percent from 2006. Area for harvest is expected to total 2.73 million acres, up slightly from last month but down 3 percent from 2006. As of September 1, the U.S. yield is forecast at 7,024 pounds per acre, up 40 pounds per acre from last month and up 156 pounds from last year. Record high yields are expected in Louisiana, Mississippi and Missouri.

**All cotton** production is forecast at 17.8 million 480-pound bales, up 3 percent from last month but down 17 percent from last year's 21.6 million bales. Yield is expected to average 811 pounds per acre, up 28 pounds from last month but down 3 pounds from 2006. The September harvested area is expected to total 10.5 million acres of all cotton, down 1 percent from last month and down 17 percent from last year. **Upland cotton** production is forecast at 17 million 480-pound bales, up 3 percent from last month but down 18 percent from 2006.

**Sugarcane** production for sugar and seed in 2007 is forecast at 30.4 million tons, 4 percent below the August forecast but 3 percent above 2006. Sugarcane growers intend to harvest 883,500 acres for sugar and seed during the 2007 crop year, down 9,500 acres from the August forecast and 14,600 acres less than last year. Yield is forecast at 34.4 tons per acre, down 0.9 ton from the previous forecast but up 1.5 tons from last year. Louisiana's production is down from last month's forecast due to lower expected harvested acres.

**Sorghum** production is forecast at 495 million bushels, up 4 percent from last month and up 78 percent from last year. Based on September 1 conditions, the yield is forecast at 73.9 bushels per acre, up 3.0 bushels from August and up 17.7 bushels from last year. If realized, this would be the highest yield on record. Area for harvest as grain is forecast at 6.70 million acres, unchanged from August but up 36 percent from last year.
