LOUISIANA CATTLE INVENTORY DECREASES

All cattle and calves on Louisiana farms as of January 1, 2004, were estimated at 850,000 head, down 1 percent from a year ago, according to Dave Frank, State Statistician for the Louisiana Agricultural Statistics Service in Baton Rouge. All cows that have calved were estimated at 530,000 head, up 2 percent from a year ago. Louisiana's 2003 calf crop was estimated at 415,000 head, the same as the 2002 calf crop.

Beef cows were estimated at 489,000 head, up 3 percent from January 1, 2003, while **milk cows**, at 41,000 head, were down 9 percent from a year ago. Other cattle inventory estimates and changes from a year ago were: **beef cow replacement heifers**, 81,000 head, down 6 percent; **milk cow replacement heifers**, 10,000 head, unchanged; **other heifers**, 17,000 head, unchanged; **steers 500 pounds and over**, 21,000 head, down 12 percent; **bulls 500 pounds and over**, 33,000 head, unchanged, and **calves under 500 pounds**, 158,000 head, down 7 percent.
