Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest Invites the Public to the Valhalla Site Management Plan Workshop

Washburn, WI – August 4, 2008: The Washburn Ranger District of the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest (CNNF) announces the final, Valhalla Site Management Plan Workshop, Saturday, August 16, 2008, 9:30 - 11:30 pm, at the Valhalla Chalet building at the Valhalla Recreation Area site, 9 miles west of Washburn, WI, on County Highway C. Mary Motiff, Director of Bayfield County Recreation and Tourism, and Spring Rosales, Washburn District Ranger for the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest will be presenting the Workshop with non-Forest Service facilitators leading participants in the session. Parking fees will be waived for participants.

The collaborative Workshop format will provide the public an opportunity to work together in small groups, for the purpose of identifying ideas, issues, and recommendations. These will be necessary to assist with the development of a new site management plan to be completed by early next year. Public participation in this process will help the CNNF to:

- Understand what the public values about Valhalla Recreation Area;
- Provide perspectives on the future potential of Valhalla in terms of opportunities;
- Provide ideas for Valhalla in ways that align the opportunities offered with the values held by the public and contribute towards the needs of the Bayfield County comprehensive outdoor recreation package;
- And, become participants to implement the management plan for Valhalla.
