"Old Fort Laramie"

Fort Laramie in central Wyoming was the most important trading and military post in the American West. Originally constructed in 1834 as a private fur trading post known as Fort William and later Fort John, it was purchased by the Federal Government in 1849, reconfigured, and functioned as a military post until its closure in 1890. During its long period of occupation, Fort Laramie was an integral part of the development of the American West: fur trading, the Oregon Trail, Indian wars, peace treaties, the Pony Express, the telegraph.

One image shows the former cavalry barracks at Fort Laramie in the spring of 1909. This barracks building was constructed in 1874 and, at times, housed infantry as well as cavalry troops stationed at the fort. It is one of the few remaining complete structures at the Fort Laramie National Historic Site. It has undergone some refurbishment and currently features reconstructed and authentically furnished sleeping and living areas.

The other image, also photographed in 1909, is of the bachelor officer's quarters, known as "Old Bedlam" for the sometimes raucous activities that occurred there. Built in 1849, it is the oldest structure at the site and one of the oldest buildings in Wyoming. It has also been refurbished and now houses period furnishings.

Following the closure of the fort, equipment and some of the buildings were sold at auction, and the surrounding land was opened

for homesteading. Building materials and abandoned equipment were hauled away by locals. Livestock grazed among the ruins. Beginning in 1937, the State of Wyoming took steps to preserve the site, and in 1938 the Federal Government also took interest in the permanent preservation of Fort Laramie. It is now part of the National Park System and a popular tourist destination.

These photographs appear with others depicting Fort Laramie as it appeared in the early 1900s when engineers from the Bureau of

Reclamation were working their way along the North Platte River gathering data for future irrigation and water storage projects. The North Platte Project constructed dams and water diversion and storage facilities in

Nebraska, Kansas, eastern Colorado, and central Wyoming. This photograph album is part of a series that contains several hundred albums and many thousands

of images relating to the location, construction, and operation of dams, canals, and irrigation projects throughout the western United States. The photographs were mostly taken by photographers working for the Bureau of Reclamation and collected by the Office of Chief Engineer in Denver, Colorado. These records and others are available for research at the National Archives' regional archives in Denver.
