Subject: NPI and POS; new MMIS; MTM services; TRPP

#### **NPI** requirements and Point of Sale

On May 23, 2008, the National Provider Identifier (NPI) became mandatory for all electronic transactions. See the recent *EDI Bulletin 19* for details online at www.oregon.gov/DHS/healthplan/notices\_providers/2008/edi19\_0408.pdf.

Because of recent billing problems with NPI and the current Point of Sale (POS) interface, we will allow use of some workarounds through the end of August 2008, after which a new contractor will take over the POS administration. Until then we will accept the 6-digit legacy provider ID number format in the prescribing and dispensing provider ID fields. This includes use of the dummy numbers 999999 and BBBBBB and their logic.

There have also been problems for pharmacies with two NPIs and one National Association of Board of Pharmacies (NABP) number when the software translator or switch is not passing the claim through. It is important that you work with your software, billing service or clearinghouse in order to get the appropriate NPI for billing linked to your NABP number.

#### Verification of current enrollment

Please return the attached survey by June 30, 2008, to verify your current enrollment information as a DHS participating pharmacy that qualifies for enhanced dispensing fees. This includes participants in the 340B Discounted Pharmacy program and Long-Term Care Pharmacies. Having correct identifiers on file will help ensure timely payments when the replacement Medicaid Management Information System (MMIS) goes live.

### **Medication Therapy Management**

The Health Resources Commission (HSC) has adopted the CPT codes for Medication Therapy Management (MTM). We don't anticipate MTM codes being open for billing until the HSC guidelines can be implemented, possibly by the end of 2008.
