DELINTMENT CREEK TRAIL NOW OPEN

Hines, OR - The Delintment Creek Trail, which has been closed due to hazardous conditions caused from a wildfire in July 2007, is now open for public use, announced Jerry Hensley, Emigrant Creek District Ranger. Trail crews have reconstructed a majority of the trail and have reduced a significant amount of hazards such as, burnt trees and stump holes. However, future hazards may develop over time, so visitors are asked to use caution when using this trail. The Malheur National Forest will be assessing the trail periodically for changes.
