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1.2 - Recommended Wilderness
This prescription applies to areas the Forest Service recommends for wilderness designation. The primary management objective is to maintain the area in a natural state. Management activities shall be limited to those that are necessary for the protection of the area. This area is managed as a wilderness area and is generally subject to the provisions of the Wilderness Act.

2.2 - Research Natural Areas
This prescription applies to areas that have been administratively established as Research Natural Areas and that provide exceptional opportunities for research. Existing and proposed Research Natural Areas are managed to protect the unique values for which they were established. Management plans are developed for each area to provide guidance and protection of values.

3.1 - Passive Restoration and Maintenance of Aquatic, Terrestrial and Hydrologic Resources
This prescription is designed to minimize temporary and short-term risks and avoid long-term risks from management actions to hydrologic conditions and aquatic and terrestrial habitats. The objective of 3.1 is to manage the area in a way that maintains or improves the natural state of the area. Management actions are required to maintain or improve the natural state of the area. 3.2 - Active Restoration and Maintenance of Aquatic, Terrestrial and Hydrologic Resources
