







MELCOME

Welcome to Fort Jackson, "Victory Starts Here!"



Fort Jackson is the largest and most active Initial Entry Training Center in the U.S. Army, training 50 percent of all Sol-

diers and 70 percent of the women entering the Army each year. Providing the Army with trained, disciplined, motivated and physically fit warriors who espouse the Army's core values and are focused on teamwork is the post's primary mission. Accomplishing that mission means training in excess of 45,000 basic training and advanced individual training Soldiers every year.

The post has other missions as well.

Fort Jackson is home to the U.S. Army Soldier Support Institute, the U.S. Army Chaplains Center and School, and the Department of Defense Polygraph Institute.

The fort includes more than 52,000 acres, including more than 53 ranges and field training sites and 1,000 buildings. Among the many improvements in 2005 were a new \$61 million starbase barracks complex, Hilton Field renovations, and a \$20 million enlisted housing renovation program, which is under way. The Palmetto Greens Mini-Golf Course, Palmetto Falls Family Water Park, and Patriots Park are just some of the outstanding recreational areas Soldiers and DA civilians can enjoy.

Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen, Marines, civilians, retirees and family members make up the Fort Jackson community that continues to grow in numbers and facilities. An additional 14,000 Soldiers attend courses at the Soldier Support Institute, Chaplain Center and School and Drill Sergeant School annually. More than 3,600 active duty Soldiers and their 10,000 family members are assigned to the installation and make this area their home. Fort Jackson employs almost 4,200 civilians and provides services for more than 105,000 retirees and their family members.

Located in the heart of the Midlands region of South Carolina, Fort Jackson was incorporated into the city of Columbia in October 1968 and is midway between New York and Miami. Columbia is the only southeastern U.S. city that boasts direct access to three

interstate highways, I-20, I-26 and I-77, and indirect access to two additional interstates within 100 miles, I-95 and I-85. Average temperatures in the region range from a high of 92 degrees in July to a low of 34 in January. Annual rainfall averages around 48 inches.


The fort has a significant economic impact on the local area, contributing \$2.6 billion to the local economy. In addition, over 100,000 family members visit the Midlands area each year to attend basic training graduation activities, using local hotels, restaurants and shopping areas.

Since 1917, when fighting men were needed during World War I, Fort Jackson has had a proud history of training Soldiers for America's Army. The post's initial site of 1,200 acres was purchased and donated to the federal government by the citizens of Columbia. This began a tradition of mutual respect and cooperation between the city and Fort Jackson that continues today.

ARRIVAL



If you arrive in the area by plane, you'll land at the Columbia Metropolitan Airport, built in 1965 and continuously being upgraded. Eight miles from the heart of the city, the airport is served by six airlines.

Transportation to and from the airport includes commercial buses, limousines and taxis. If you have any problems, the airport's military assistance desk can provide information Monday through Friday from 5 p.m. to 1 a.m.

Reporting In


All Soldiers, regardless of rank, are to report to the Fort Jackson Welcome Center during non-duty hours only, Monday through Friday after 4 p.m. and all day on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays. During duty hours, all permanent party Soldiers should report, in uniform, to the Strom Thurmond Soldier Service Center, Building 5450 Strom Thurmond Blvd.

The Welcome Center is located at 4394 Strom Thurmond Blvd., just inside Gate 2. A 24-hour operation, the Welcome Center is staffed and ready to serve all Soldiers and anyone needing information or directions on Fort Jackson. The Welcome Center can be reached by dialing (803) 782-9802. If you need a reservation at Fort Jackson lodging, you need to call toll free (800) 276-6884.

Soldiers requesting leave extensions should call Officer Management at 751-6606 or Enlisted Management at 751-4411 from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. After 4:30 p.m., leave extensions must be coordinated through the Staff Duty Officer by calling 751-7611.

Inbound Household Goods/ Unaccompanied Baggage

Incoming Soldiers should, at their first opportunity, contact the Transportation



Office in the Strom Thurmond Building, Room 102, if they have unaccompanied baggage or household goods en route to Fort Jackson. In the event that property has not arrived here, Soldiers should provide a work and/or contact telephone number. This initial contact may save the Soldier considerable time in arranging for delivery. For more information about inbound household goods shipments, call 751-7694/7695. Because of the high volume of calls received, contact information can be faxed to the "Inbound Section" at 751-4437. Be sure to include the full name of sponsor and the area code with phone numbers.

Outbound Household Goods/ Unaccompanied Baggage

Soldiers departing the installation for permanent change of station, retirement or separation should contact the Personal Property Branch at 751-5137/5138 to arrange an outbound counseling at least 30 days in advance of their anticipated move. During the summer months, May-August, 60 days advance notice is required. DoD or DA civilians PCSing overseas should do the same thing.

On the date of counseling, the member should bring four copies of his/her orders for each type of shipment to be made (HHG to destination, HHG to storage, baggage, etc.) and an inventory sheet of items to be moved. Inventory sheets are available in advance in Room 102 of the Strom Thurmond Building, 5450 Strom Thurmond Blvd.

Outbound Travel Services

Personnel Movements Branch, Directorate of Logistics and Engineering, located in Building 4350 on Magruder Ave., is the place to visit for all your official travel needs.

The Personnel Movements Branch arranges travel and issues tickets for TDY, PCS and ETS moves. This office also processes passport and visa applications. Proper identification and orders are needed to arrange any of these services. Port call and dependent travel services are handled by appointment. Call 751-6053/7531. To make a TDY reservation, call 782-2966.

Uniform Policy

Permanent party Soldiers may wear the Battle Dress Uniform (BDU) or Army Combat Uniform (ACU) off post. Alcoholic beverages may not be consumed in any off-post establishment while wearing BDUs/ACUs. BDUs/ACUs may not be worn at off-post sporting events, theaters or other public entertainment or other events, BDUs/ACUs will not be worn offpost to social or official functions when it would be appropriate to wear the service uniform or civilian attire. BDU/ACU sleeves will be worn down at all times. Sailors or deploying Soldiers authorized to wear the DCU uniform can wear the DCU uniform off-post. Uniforms will be worn properly bloused, zipped and buttoned with sleeves worn down. Utility uniforms will be serviceable and present a clean appearance if worn off post.

Driver's License

Military personnel and their family members are not required to obtain South Carolina driver's licenses or license plates as long as they have valid ones from other states. Expiration of a service member's driving license is different depending upon its state of origin. Upon arrival in South Carolina, you should contact the South Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles to determine the laws governing your current license. If you do not have a valid driver's license, you must pass a written examination and a road test (\$2 test fee) within 90 days of your arrival. The driver's license fee is \$12.50. A learner's permit (\$2.50 fee) may be issued at the age of 15 and an unrestricted license at the age of 16. The DMV is located at 1630 Shop Road, Columbia, S.C. 29202. Vehicle Registration

Fort Jackson is a limited access installation. All vehicles must be registered with the installation. Authorized personnel (active duty/retired military, DoD civilians and contractors) can obtain a decal for their vehicle in the Strom Thurmond

Building, Room 1022, Monday through Friday, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Registrants are required to show proof of insurance, vehicle registration, driver's license, and military identification.


The installation motorcycle policy applies to all Soldiers at all times, civilians while on the installation, and all civilians operating a motorcycle off post on official military business. All motorcycle owners are required to successfully complete the approved Motorcycle Safety Foundations (MSF) Course before registering their motorcycle on Fort Jackson. The course is provided by the Fort Jackson Safety Office at no cost to military personnel or DoD civilians, and personnel will not be charged leave to attend the course. All operators and passengers must wear the following personal protective equipment when operating a motorcycle: Department of Transportation approved helmet properly fastened; Soldiers must wear helmet on and off post regardless of South Carolina State Law; impact or shatter resistant goggles, wrap-around goggles, or full face shield (attached to helmet); long pants; long sleeved shirt or jacket; full fingered gloves; leather boots or over-the-ankle shoes; a brightly colored reflective safety vests during daylight conditions and a retro-reflective vest during hours of darkness, vests will be clearly visible and not covered; a sash or belt does not satisfy this requirement. Motorcycles must have two rear view mirrors and have headlights turned on at all times.

South Carolina does not require a vehicle safety inspection sticker. However, personnel assigned permanently to Fort Jackson who have POVs registered in a state that requires a state inspection must properly display a state inspection sticker on their vehicles.

On-Post Traffic Violations

Traffic violations are handled through the U.S. Magistrate Court. An offender may either pay the fine or go before a magistrate for resolution of the violation.





Fines range to more than \$1,000 for driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Assessment of traffic points usually accompanies traffic violations. In South Carolina, drivers may accumulate only 12 points.

The state has a compulsory seatbelt law, which also applies when driving on Fort Jackson. Additionally, children age 4 and under traveling in a vehicle's front seat must be secured in restraining devices approved by the National Safety Products Council. Children 5 and under traveling in the back seat must also be in a restraint. Children 6 and older who are traveling in the back seat must wear seatbelts.

On Fort Jackson, the speed limit is 25 mph unless otherwise posted. Right turns on red are permitted, and speed limits on post, the interstate and other highways are strictly enforced. Additionally, state law mandates that when windshield wipers are in use, headlights must also be turned on.

Fort Jackson Military Police enforce all traffic and on-post regulations.

Effective May 15, 2006, Fort Jackson implemented a new policy affecting the use of cell phones and other communication devices while operating a moving motor vehicle on post. Fort Jackson Supplement 1 to Army Regulation 190-5 prohibits the use of a cell phone or any other

communications device while operating a moving motor vehicle. This includes devices that allow you to speak over a cell phone without using your hands to hold the phone or communication devices which have a speaker and microphone.

If you receive a phone call, or need to make a call, you are to first pull over to a safe location. Passengers in moving motor vehicles are allowed to use cell phones, but to minimize distraction to the vehicle operator, are not allowed to use a speaker or other device that allows the conversation to be heard by the driver. Signs reflecting this policy are posted at all gates, major intersections on the installation and at Hilton Field entrances and exits to inform and remind drivers and passengers about this policy. Armed Forces Traffic Tickets will be issued to operators of vehicles who do not follow this policy. For more information call the Fort Jackson PMO at 751-3030.

Parking is not allowed on grassy areas or in reserved parking spaces/lots on the installation. Parking is not allowed on sidewalks next to the barracks or billeting areas or in areas designated for loading or unloading.

Citations are given for vehicles playing loud music on post. Music should not be heard at a distance of more than 125 feet (42 yards). Fort Jackson Supplement 1 to AR 190-5 requires all personnel riding

bicycles on the installation to wear an approved bicycle safety helmet and follow safety guidelines.

There are many pedestrian crosswalks located around the installation. All vehicles must stop when approaching a crosswalk where a pedestrian is waiting to cross. Citations are issued for failure to yield the right of way to a pedestrian and carry a fine of \$60.00.

Running Routes

Running routes are established on Fort Jackson for the safety of the Soldiers doing physical fitness training in the morning. Since the majority of Soldiers on Fort Jackson are in Basic Combat Training and not accustomed to running in traffic, orange cones mark the run routes.

Running routes are closed from 5:50 a.m. to 7 a.m. Monday through Saturday. Permanent party units' run routes usually end at 7 a.m. Monday through Friday. Moving a cone or driving through a coned barrier into a running route will result in a traffic fine and could lead to revocation of driving privileges on post. Running is prohibited on Marion Avenue in the morning hours except by Soldiers participating in group physical fitness training. Runners are prohibited from wearing headphones or earphones.

Bicycle Registration/Operation

Bicycle registration is highly encouraged at the PMO/Force Protection Branch. Registration of bicycle serial numbers is a crime prevention method and in the event of a theft, gives investigators something to work with. Bicycle operators/passengers must wear approved helmets. The wearing of headphones or earphones is prohibited by anyone operating a motor vehicle, moped, motorcycle, bicycle, or when running.

Weapons Registration

All persons bringing privately owned weapons onto the installation must register them with their unit commander/



supervisor within five working days of assignment/employment using FJ Form 190-11-100.

Transportation & Storage of Privately Owned Weapons

Fort Jackson Supplement 1 to AR 190-11 prohibits keeping privately owned weapons in vehicles, even when properly secured, while at work or while attending to other business on the installation not directly related to authorized shooting activities on the installation.

If transporting a privately owned weapon in a vehicle, it must be done in a manner prescribed by the laws of South Carolina and must be properly secured by ensuring the weapon is unloaded and that the ammunition is secured in a separate container and area of the vehicle. Pistols must be secured in a closed glove box, console or trunk compartment, or if the vehicle does not have a trunk-type compartment, preferably in a separate locked container (e.g., gun case), or in a locked gun rack. In addition, carrying concealed firearms on one's person except by military, state or federal law enforcement authorities in performance of their duties is prohibited.

Pets

Pet owners living on the installation must register their animals within five working days of their arrival. This should be done at the Fort Jackson Veterinary Clinic, Building 2445, Knight Avenue. To register your pet, proof of rabies immunization is required.

The Veterinary Treatment Facility provides limited medical care for pets, by appointment only. Such care includes immunizations, heartworm and intestinal parasite examinations, preventive medication, health certificate exams and sick-call evaluations.

The clinic can perform routine surgeries such as spaying, but it cannot board pets. Also, because it is a non-appropriated funds-supported facility that must support itself, fees are charged for all services and medications. Flea and tick products and other over-the-counter items are sold at the clinic. A \$2 user's fee for each transaction is required.

All dogs and cats three months and older must be registered, and current rabies vaccinations are required.

Dogs must have current distemper, hepatitis, leptopirosis and parvo vaccinations and must be on heartworm prevention. Cats must be vaccinated for distemper, feline leukemia and upperrespiratory diseases.

All animals living on post must be micro-chipped. If this procedure is done off post, the microchip number must be reported to the VTF and filed in the animal's record. Cost of the procedure is \$15.

If you plan to live off the installation and intend to use the Veterinary Clinic or specified areas of Fort Jackson for hunting, you also must register your animals at the clinic. Soldiers and their families living off post also need to review local ordinances regarding the supervision and upkeep of family pets. In Richland County, call the Department of Public Works Animal Control Office at 735-7322.

The Veterinary Clinic also maintains an animal shelter where unclaimed strays may be adopted. The clinic will neuter these animals for a reduced cost. All animals will be vaccinated and free of heartworm disease.

The clinic is open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. Please call 751-7160 for an appointment. Over-the-counter sales are available from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Better Business Bureau

Investigate before you invest. Those are wise words, particularly when you're new to an area. Before you sign a lease, buy a new car or purchase furniture for your new home, determine whether the company you're about to deal with is reputable.

An easy way to do this is to contact the Better Business Bureau of the Midlands, which maintains lists of businesses that have unresolved consumer complaints or unfair business practices. The bureau also can help consumers resolve complaints with businesses. All services are free. On-Post Housing

Fort Jackson's permanent party on-post housing is divided into eight areas, seven for enlisted and one for officers' families for a total of 1,182 family housing units. While all units are unfurnished, they are equipped with central heating and air conditioning, refrigerators and gas ranges.



Many of the units have dishwashers built in, and portable dishwashers are available for others. The stucco houses in Pierce Terrace Housing Area 7, which were built in 1988, have carports.

For enlisted Soldiers, there are 402 two-bedroom, 438 three-bedroom, and 246 four-bedroom units. We have 99 units for officers, to include three General Officers' quarters. There are 88 units with two to four bedrooms designated for Company Grade and Field Grade officers and eight units designated for Key and Essential officers.

Off-Post Housing Referral

Fort Jackson will make every effort to help families find suitable housing when you relocate to the Columbia area. The Installation's Housing Division, located in Rooms 240-242 of the Strom Thurmond Building, is ready to provide you with personal service and information.

Open weekdays from 7:30 a.m. to 4:15 p.m., Division employees will be placed on a waiting list for on-post housing and notified as soon as housing is available. For further information, call 751-7567/5331/7571/5184.

If on-post housing is unavailable, the Housing Division will assist with locating suitable off-post housing. The telephone

number for Community Homefinding, Relocation and Referral Services (CHRRS) is 751-7101/7566/5187.

Applying for Government Quarters

All incoming Soldiers interested in applying for on-post housing must report to the Assignment and Termination Section of the Housing Services Office with a copy of their assignment orders.

This section will take your application for housing, discuss bedroom requirements, the availability of quarters and put you on the appropriate waiting list. Your position on the list is determined by the departure date from your last permanent duty station. All persons returning from a non-accompanied hardship tour will be inserted just below the top 10 percent of the waiting list.

Personnel eligible to apply for quarters are those in a PCS status, i.e. signed out from their last permanent duty station.

Selecting a Home

If on-post housing is unavailable or you would prefer to live off post, select your home after considering the following:

- Is the size adequate for your family with the possibility of additions to your family?
- Is the cost within your means?

- Will the neighborhood be a safe, secure place for the growth and well being of your family?
- Will the location provide access to shopping centers, churches, schools and playgrounds for your family?
- Soldiers on permissive temporary duty (PTDY) for house hunting must report to the CHRRS Office before beginning their PTDY.
- Once you've made your choice, read your lease carefully before signing.
- Make sure you're given a check-in inspection list, and note the condition of the residence at the time of occupancy. If there are any problems when you take possession, have it stated on the inspection list with the landlord's signature on your copy. Reviewing this will come in handy when you're ready to move.
- Once you do plan to move, have the landlord sign the list again. If this is not done, you may find yourself paying for damages when you leave. The CHRRS Office personnel can provide you with other tips about smart leasing.

LEGAL

Residential Lease Agreement

A written lease agreement is usually required for most residential leases. This agreement should outline the responsibilities and obligations of all parties and should constitute the entirety of the agreement. Before signing a lease agreement, make sure you understand everything written in the agreement. Signing the agreement is generally evidence of that party's intent to be bound and agree to all the terms within the agreement.

Oral Representations

When shopping for a rental property, many property managers may make oral representations to potential tenants in regards to many aspects of the property. Oral representations that conflict with written provisions in a lease are generally unenforceable. Oral evidence that modifies a written lease agreement is likewise generally inadmissible in court. The written lease agreement controls the obligations of the parties and is generally the enforceable agreement.

Landlord and Tenant obligations

The written lease agreement will outline the obligations of both the landlord and tenant. However, according to South Carolina law, landlords and tenants have general obligations when leasing a rental property. Landlords have a general obligation to maintain premises. Landlords must comply with all applicable building codes, make repairs and keep the premises in a fit and habitable condition, and keep all common areas safe. A landlord may also be required to make running water, hot water, and heat available as well as keep all electrical, gas, plumbing, sanitary, heating, ventilating, air conditioning and other facilities in working order if these obligations are not specified in the written agreement to be the tenant's obligations. Tenants have a general obligation to comply with all building and housing codes, to keep the dwelling unit reasonably safe and clean, dispose of trash, keep all plumbing fixtures clean, and use all electrical, plumbing, sanitary, heating, ventilating, air conditioning and other facilities in a reasonable manner. The tenant may also incur further obligations as outlined by the written lease agreement.

Conflicts

In the event a conflict occurs between a landlord and tenant in regards to a provision or obligation in the lease agreement, the aggrieved party should provide written notice to the other party explaining the conflict. Generally, if a tenant provides written notice to a landlord about a conflict, the landlord usually has 14 days to remedy or make reasonable effort to remedy the conflict before the tenant may take further action. If both parties cannot come to terms concerning a conflict with the lease agreement, their legal recourse will be to file an action in a court of proper jurisdiction, usually the magistrate's court, for a judicial remedy. All parties, however, have a duty to mitigate damages.

Security Deposits

Security deposits are usually an upfront expense a tenant pays a landlord to secure their interest in the leased property. Security deposits may also provide a means for a landlord to seek reimbursement for damage to the property or repair costs. Generally, a landlord has an obligation to maintain the premises and should not use the security deposit to pay for normal wear and tear on a premises. According to South Carolina law, a landlord is required to provide the security deposit, less amounts used for repairs and damages, along with a itemized list of expenses to a tenant no later than 30 days after termination of a written lease agreement. The tenant is required to provide the landlord with written notification of a forwarding address. If this provision is violated, a tenant may have a legal cause of action and may seek treble damages (three times the amount of damages) plus reasonable attorney's fees by statute.


Early Termination

A written lease agreement will usually contain the date of termination of the agreement. Parties may have the option of renewing the lease, usually with new terms or increased rent, by providing written notice. Most residential leases are for a one year period, but may be longer or shorter. Termination of the lease before the termination date may give the aggrieved party a legal action for damages. Damages are usually the monetary damages a landlord may incur for this early termination. Many leases also include early termination clauses and provisions that cover the procedures for terminating the lease early, often with some sort of penalty fee provision and/or a liquidated damages clause designed to estimate the amount of monetary loss a party would suffer for this early termination. These clauses are often drafted to protect the landlord's interests and can make it difficult or more costly for a tenant to terminate the lease early. This is usually to ensure that the tenant either performs the obligations they agreed to in the contract for the contract period or compensates the landlord for this early termination.

SCRA and Lease Termination

The new Service member's Civil Relief Act of 2003 has some added provisions that may help service members terminate a residential lease agreement prior to the termination date. The SCRA is not limited only to protections covering lease termination. Other protections include issues such as security deposits, prepaid rent, eviction, installment contracts, credit card interest rates, mortgage interest rates, mortgage foreclosure, civil judicial proceedings, and income tax payments. It also provides many important protections to military members while on active duty.

To receive protection under some parts of the SCRA, the service member must be prepared to show that military service has had a "material effect" on the legal or financial matter involved. Protection under the SCRA must be requested during the member's military duty or within 30 to 180 days after military



service ends, depending on the protection being requested.

In many situations, the SCRA protections are not automatic, but require some action to invoke the Act. For example, to obtain a reduction of your pre-active duty mortgage or credit card interest rates, you should send your lender/creditor a written request and a copy of your mobilization orders.

In particular to residential leases, section 535 of the SCRA allows service members to terminate residential (and automobile) leases without penalty fees, provided they have received PCS orders or deployment orders for deployments in

excess of 90 days. However, the service member may only terminate a lease under this provision on or after the date of entry in military service. The service member need only provide written notice of their intent to terminate a lease under this provision at least 30 from days the intended termination date and a copy of their orders. The definition of orders is broad and may include command memorandums.

In addition, this provision is extended to all dependents of service members that may also be a party to the lease. Dependents are defined as a spouse, child or an individual to whom a service member has provided over half of their support for 180 days prior to application for relief under the SCRA.

Off-Post Conduct

Fort Jackson and the City of Columbia have enjoyed a model relationship for many years, and the installation community is particularly proud of this fact. Those who work at Fort Jackson should be mindful that, because of their government association, their conduct reflects on the Army. Soldiers and their family members who reside off-post should be aware that such residency requires exemplary behavior in conducting business transactions safeguarding of private property, meeting obligations, and maintaining good housekeeping practices.

Personnel will abide by local laws and ordinances, and will extend the same respect toward local citizens and personal property as they do when living on the Installation.

Soldiers and their families are good citizens, and we want to maintain that image with the local community. The following are reminders that could help you avoid tricky situations:

- 1. Pay rent and other fees by the due date.
- Keep the interior and exterior of your dwelling in a good state of cleanliness.
- 3. Control your children and pets.
- 4. Avoid damage to private property. When damage occurs, make necessary repairs or assessments promptly.
- 5. Learn and abide by all house rules; particularly in multiple-family dwellings, such as apartments, promptly.
- 6. Notify the owner or landlord of needed repairs.
- 7. Avoid disturbing your neighbors: practice the Golden Rule.
- 8. Give required notification before termination of occupancy.
- 9. Leave your home clean and undamaged. This should be done whether or not it is spelled out in your lease agreement.



The ACAP Center conducts a monthly workshop where the client learns about resume writing, translating military experience into civilian terminology, marketing and networking skills, how to dress for success and prepare for job interviews, job offer and salary negotiation and other job-search skills.

The ACAP Center has a job announcement bulletin board, and a reference library made up of veterans' training and labor market information. It assists clients in obtaining DD Form 2586, Verification of Military Experience and Training (VMET) and associated documents.

The ACAP Center has an automated self-service resume writer. The resume writer has two built-in formats for resumes, a built-in cover letter and thank you format and word processing. All are produced on a LaserJet printer.

The ACAP Center also provides the following services and information:

Coker College is a member of the Service Members Opportunity Colleges (SOC) program, which enables active-duty Soldiers and their spouses to graduate from Coker while serving in other locations. Claffin University on Fort Jackson offers two undergraduate degrees that lead to initial teacher certification: the Bachelor of Science in elementary

education (Grades 2-6) and the Bachelor of Science in middle level education (Grades 5-8). Prior university level coursework is required for admission. Curriculum for all center programs is child-oriented with an emphasis on creative, age-appropriate activities, which encourage children to acquire knowledge about themselves and their environment and prepare them to succeed academically. Both centers are accredited through the National Association for the Education of Young Children and are committed to providing quality options for the children of the Fort Jackson community.

Child Development Homes

A recent newcomer to the CYS family of programs is the Child Development Homes. Located at 5955 A/B Parker Lane in the housing area, the homes first opened in the fall of 2005. A CD home is a cross between a child development center and a family child care home. It provides small group care for children in a home setting by paid staff. The CD homes at Fort Jackson were initiated to meet the demands for mission related extended hours child care. The home opens Monday through Friday from 4 a.m. to 9 p.m. and on Saturdays from 5 a.m. to 6 p.m. Arrangements for use of the CD homes are handled by the Hood Street Child Development Center Director.

Family Child Care

The Family Child Care Program is a system of home-based childcare. Family members living in government housing who provide child care for more than 10 hours per week on a regular basis are required to be certified through this program. This requirement does not apply to care given in the child's home. Family Child Care provider applicants go through

an extensive certification process before being allowed to care for children in their government quarters. Once certified, these individuals provide services that offer an alternative to and/or complement the care given in centers. Some providers on Fort Jackson offer extended hours care that meets the needs of Soldiers in drill status and those working shifts. The Family Child Care program has recently expanded to include off post providers. For assistance in finding a home care provider, contact the Central Enrollment Office or Family Child Care Office at 751-6234.

Youth Center

The Youth Center, located on the corner of Imboden Parkway and Chesnut Road, serves as the focal point for many youth programs and is an affiliate of the Boys and Girls Club of America. School Age Services, Middle School/Teen programs and Youth Sports are all homebased in this facility. The center provides open recreation and opportunities for youth at scheduled times and are the site of many special events and activities such as dances, lock-ins, block parties, and sports and games contests.

School Age Services

School Age Services is based at the Youth Center but utilizes many other post facilities to enhance the quality of its services. It operates before and after-school options during the public school year for children in grades one through five and full day options during the summer months. The before school program operates from 5:15 a.m. to 8 a.m. and provides transportation or escort services to each of the three Fort Jackson elementary schools as well as four local off post schools. After-school options operate from 2:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m., including pick up services from Fort Jackson schools and seven local off post schools. During teacher in-service days and school holidays, the program operates from 5:15 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.

The curriculum is based on four service areas: fitness and sports; leisure

and recreation; life skills and citizenship; and mentoring and support. Youth are offered a choice in the type and frequency of activities. Typical activities include the computer lab, homework assistance, leisure time, sports and fitness activities, arts and crafts, instructional classes and club time. During the summer months, the curriculum includes field trips and off-site activities that cannot be accomplished during the school year.

Whether enrolled in a Before- or Afterschool program or not, school age children are encouraged to participate on the Preteen Council and assist staff in programming activities and events for their age group. Youth registered with Child and Youth Services but not enrolled in a regularly scheduled program receive three free afternoons a month as well as operating hours on Saturday and Sunday. Additional afternoons are available for a daily rate. A monthly calendar is available that outlines events/activities for school age children.

Middle School/Teen Program

Options for middle school and high school youth include four service areas: sports and fitness, leisure and recreation, life skills and leadership, and intervention and support. Middle school youth and teens are encouraged to be active members of the Torch and Keystone Leadership clubs and assist staff in the programming activities and events for their age group. A monthly calendar of events is available.

In 2000, the Middle School/Teen Program established an after-school program for youth in grades six through eight. This program is offered at no cost to parents. The Middle School After-School Program, "Programs on Parker," operates from the "House"—four sets of former government quarters located at 5957 Parker Lane. During the summer, the Middle School/Teen Program offers a variety of camp options for middle school youth and teens.

Youth Services also has a year-round Teen Hire Program. Teens 14 and up may apply at the Non-appropriated Fund Personnel Office for one of the Teen Hire positions at the Youth Center. These teens are taught employment skills in a supportive environment and are given an opportunity to gain experience that will help them find other employment.

Youth Sports & Fitness

Fort Jackson's Youth Sports & Fitness Program is a great place for youth to learn sportsmanship, practice new skills and make new friends. Youth Sports



attempts to de-emphasize competition, while encouraging youths to have fun and learn fundamentals of the game.

A variety of sports, including flag football, cheerleading, soccer, basketball, baseball, volleyball, cross country, swimming and track are offered. Youth Sports also provides fitness activities and health and nutrition education throughout the year. The Youth Sports Branch boasts a modern Youth Sports Park, which features several softball and baseball diamonds, soccer fields, a football field and a concession area for game days.

Mobile Recreation

Each summer, Child & Youth Services takes to the street providing recreational activities for youth on housing area and/or school playgrounds. In 2006, this service was expanded to two off post locations, the Summit and Lake Carolina, due to their high concentration of military residents. The activities are provided free of charge and intended to give children who do not need full day camp something to do during the long, hot summer. Child & Youth Services is also available to support unit organization days with recreational activities for children. For more information, contact Outreach Services at 751-4869.

SKIESUnlimited School of Knowledge, Inspiration, Exploration and Skills

SKIESUnlimited provides the framework for Child & Youth Services instructional programs with offerings provided through the School of the Arts, School of Academics, School of Sports and School of Life Skills. Initiated in August 2005, Fort Jackson now offers programs in dance, piano, keyboarding, voice, gymnastics, cheerleading, sewing, SAT preparation and martial arts. Contact the CYS Central Enrollment Office for more information about upcoming classes. Don't see something you are interested in? Contact the Youth Education & Support Services Director at 751-3053.

4-H Clubs

Child & Youth Services is a 4-H affiliate and offers a variety of 4-H Clubs on the installation for youth during the school year. Most clubs meet on Wednesday afternoons. The Scales Avenue Child Development Center is the site of the 4-H Club for children in kindergarten. School Age Services provides a variety of 4-H clubs for youth in grades one through five and the Middle School/Teen Program does the same for youth in grades six a nd up. 4-H Clubs are developed around the interests of club members and may change from school year to school year. Children/youth do not have to be enrolled in regularly scheduled program to take advantage of the 4-H clubs. All that is necessary is CYS registration; the Club participation is free. For more information, contact the appropriate program for your child's grade.

Scouting

Fort Jackson has a strong foundation in scouting and can offer a wide variety of programs for all ages. The POC for the Boy Scout programs is Don Copley at (803) 699-1720 and the POC for the Girl Scout programs is Norma Ferguson at (803) 736-5875.

Boy Scouts of America was incorporated to provide a program for community organizations that offers effective character, citizenship, and personal fitness training for youth. Specifically, the BSA endeavors to develop American citizens who are physically, mentally, and emotionally fit; have a high degree of selfreliance as evidenced in such qualities as initiative, courage, and resourcefulness; have personal values based on religious concepts; have the desire and skills to help others; understand the principles of the American social, economic, and governmental systems; are knowledgeable about and take pride in their American heritage and understand our nation's role in the world; have a keen respect for the basic rights of all people; and are prepared to participate in and give leadership to American society.

Cub Scouts do fun things with other kids! They get to wear a cool uniform, go places, and see things. They play all kinds of sports and build things, like race cars and birdhouses. Want to learn a secret code? Want to learn about wild animals? If you're a boy in the first through fifth grades (ages 7 to 10), go Cub Scouting!

Boy Scouts get away from it all! They camp, hike, and fish in the great outdoors. They get together in troops and try out new experiences. Scouting is available to boys who are 11 to 17 years old, or who have earned the Arrow of Light Award, or have completed the fifth grade.

Venturing is for young adults ages 14 to 20 who, along with adult leaders, are registered with the Boy Scouts of America. The program matches the interests of young adults with adult expertise and resources of the chartered organization and other adults in the community.

Girls Scouts

The Girl Scout program can change the way girls see the world and their place in it. Girls learn the importance of personal responsibility, the value of goalsetting, the spirit of teamwork, and the thrill of accomplishment. The Girl Scout program is based on the Girl Scout Promise and Law and four fundamental goals that encourage girls to: 1. Develop to their full potential. 2. Relate to others with increasing understanding, skill, and respect. 3. Develop a meaningful set of values to guide their actions and to provide for sound decision-making. 4. Contribute to the improvement of society.

Girl Scouts are divided into Daisy Girl Scouts (ages 5-6), Brownie Girl Scouts (ages 6-8), Junior Girl Scouts (ages 8-11), and STUDIO 2BSM for girls ages 11-17.

Religious Support

Worship services, fellowship, and counseling are available at all six of Fort Jackson's installation chapels. Schedules for services, including denominational and ethnic rites, can be obtained by

calling 751-3122/3121 or by visiting the Installation Chaplain's Office, Building 5450 Strom Thurmond Blvd., Room 223.

Updated schedules are posted in the installation's weekly newspaper, The Fort Jackson Leader, on the "Chaplain Corner" page. Chaplains provide the opportunity for free exercise of religion in the practice of religious beliefs, traditions, and customs to strengthen the spiritual lives of Soldiers, family members, retirees and civilians on post.

The Chapel Volunteer Program plays a tremendous part in the overall religious support within the Fort Jackson community. Volunteers contribute thousands of hours in a variety of activities and events that provide both healing and outreach ministries. The success of our religious activities depends, to a large degree, on volunteers.

Anderson Chapel

A Troop Chapel located at 32335 Jackson Blvd. and Anderson Street that offers a Church of Christ Service at 11:30 a.m. on Sundays.

Daniel Circle Chapel

Located on Jackson Boulevard across from Darby Field, Daniel Circle Chapel also serves the permanent party population. This large and vibrant collective Protestant gospel congregation has a complete program consisting of children's, youth, men's, and women's ministries. Worship services begin each Sunday at 8 a.m. and 11 a.m. For more information on services at Daniel Circle Chapel, call 751-7094.

Main Post Chapel

Opened in early 1986, the Main Post Chapel is designed to serve the installation's permanent party population. Conveniently located at the corner of Strom Thurmond Boulevard and Scales Street, near the housing areas and adjacent to the Child Care Center, Education Center, and Hood Street School, the chapel is used for family services by Protestant, Catholic, and Islamic congregations. Protestant programs include Sunday School, Christian Women's Fellowship, PYOC, and Bible studies. Catholic programs include weekday Mass, CCD and Catholic Youth of the Chapel. Memorial Chapel

Memorial Chapel is also located on Jackson Boulevard, is Fort Jackson's historic chapel. It is the original main installation chapel and displays the flags of the 11 divisions that have been stationed on Fort Jackson. A very active Protestant congregation worships here each Sunday at 11 a.m. In addition, Lutheran/Episcopal and Jewish services are conducted on Sundays. This chapel is not open during the week but is available for weddings on Saturdays.

Tank Hill Chapel

Tank Hill Chapel, a Troop Chapel located at 9476 Kemper St., is the location of the Family Life Center. It offers a Hispanic Spoken Protestant service at 8 a.m. on Sundays.

Vanguard Chapel (Formerly Magruder Chapel)

A Troop Chapel located at 4360 Magruder Ave.

Counseling

In addition to their primary roles in religious services, chaplains perform a wide range of counseling duties and work closely with other agencies such as Army Community Service, the American Red Cross, and the Community Mental Health Activity.

Chaplain's Family Life Center

The Chaplain's Family Life Center's mission is to improve the quality of life within the community by dealing with personal, marital, and relational problems. It is a safe place that provides preventive education, enrichment programs, and pastoral care for Soldiers, family members, retirees, their family members, and civilians of the Fort Jackson community.

Counseling appointments are made through unit chaplains, family support agencies, and medical or command referrals. For more information, call the Chaplain's Family Life Center at 751-4101/4542. SCHOOLS

On-Post Elementary Schools

Fort Jackson's Elementary Schools are authorized under Section 2164 of Title 10, United States Code and are among 13 states with DoD School Systems, commonly referred to as Domestic Dependent Elementary and Secondary Schools (DDESS). In 2003, the Fort Jackson Schools became part of a newly consolidated school district for the State of South Carolina and part of Georgia. The Laurel Bay Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) in Beaufort, S.C., and Fort Stewart, Ga., form the other portions of the new consolidation, now known as the South Carolina/Fort Stewart DoD DDESS District.

Hood Street

Hood Street Elementary School is the original school building and houses all second and third grade students. Although constructed in 1963, the school has undergone several upgrades in recent years, to include technology improvements, playground expansion, modern breezeways and additional "facelift" projects. In school year 1996-97, Hood Street was recognized as a National Blue Ribbon School by the U.S. Department of Education.

Pierce Terrace

Pierce Terrace provides for all 4-yearolds, kindergarten and first grade students. Construction of a four-classroom addition was completed for use in school year 2004-2005. The two-level structure was opened in 1972 as an "open design" facility. Many changes have been made since then, and the school now functions with self-contained classrooms.

Charles Cotesworth Pinckney

Opened in 1987, Charles Cotesworth Pinckney Elementary School serves



children in grades four through six. This state-of-the-art facility contains a science lab, gymnasium, computer lab, career education center and a completely developed out-door recreation area including tennis court, a soccer and football field, baseball complex, apparatus and equipment play area, hard-surfaced basketball courts and numerous private benches.

The Fort Jackson school system's most important goal is to structure the curriculum and instructional program so that transient military children are accommodated based upon their educational needs. The schools are staffed with all the necessary regular classroom and specialty teachers, and educational aides are available to help all new children acclimate as they are enrolled. The schools serve dependent children in pre-kindergarten through sixth grade who live on post in permanent quarters.

Off-Post Schools

Children living on post attend Dent Middle School for grades seven and eight, and Richland Northeast High School for grades nine through 12. Both schools have earned Blue Ribbons twice from the U.S. Department of Education. The award is presented to public schools that are unusually effective in meeting local, state and national goals in educating all of their children.

Richland Northeast stresses parental and community support, staff dedication to quality education and high standards. The high school strives to maintain a diverse curriculum and a staff that is willing to work with each of its approximately 1,600 students in a small-school atmosphere. For children living off post, each school district in the area provides good quality neighborhood schools.

Richland School District Two Expanded Choice and Magnet Programs

All Richland District Two students have the option of attending the school to which they are zoned, or they may apply for Expanded Choice to attend another school.

At designated times of the year students may apply to attend a different school than the one in their attendance area either through the district's various magnet programs and/or the district's Expanded School Choice Program. Magnet programs are available at every grade level for science, technology, performing arts, single gender, classic education, and more.

Expanded Choice deadline is Jan. 31; magnet program deadlines vary. Students living on post may apply for school choice during the 6th grade for the 7th grade year and any year after. On post students may also apply for magnet programs during the 5th grade for the 6th grade year and any year after.

Immunizations and Other Important Information

Parents of entering 4-year-olds, kindergartners and first grade should bring birth certificates and a South Carolina Certificate of Immunization to the school when they register students. For children in other grades entering school in South Carolina for the first time, parents will need to present the immunization certificate and report card from the child's last school.

All parents must also furnish a government identification card and proof of onpost housing or a letter from housing indicating that quarters will be made available within 90 school days.

Guidelines for Enrollment in Richland School District Two

The following is a list of guidelines for enrollment in Richland School District Two. Students must reside in Richland School District with their parent(s) or legal guardian(s) to be eligible.

To ensure that students are qualified for enrollment, proof of residency is required. Documents for that purpose are:

• The original copy of the parent's or guardian's lease showing the address of the dwelling as well as landlord's name, address and telephone number. Students from apartment complexes or other multiple family dwellings need to be on the letterhead stationary

showing the appropriate information mentioned above.

- The original copy of the parent or guardian's current telephone bill showing correct name and address.
 The number given on the profile sheet must agree with the name and address on the bill. No pager numbers are accepted.
- The original copy of the parent or guardian's tax receipt, showing that both their property and residence are located in Richland School District Two.

A copy of the student's birth certificate must be presented for all kindergartners and first graders before their enrollment. Birth certificates may also be requested for students at any other grade level. To be eligible for enrollment, kindergarten students must be 5 years old on or before September 1, and first graders must be 6 years old on or before September 1. To be eligible for 4-year-old programs, a child must be 4 years old on or before Sept. 1. Hospital

birth reports are not acceptable for this purpose. If necessary, duplicate birth certificates can be obtained from the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control, Vital Records and Public Health Statistics Division at 2600 Bull St., Columbia, S.C., or a similar agency in the child's state of birth.


A valid South Carolina Certificate of Immunization must be presented for all students prior to their enrollment. Immunization against diphtheria, whooping cough, tetanus, polio and red and German measles are required for all students. A second MMR immunization is required for students entering kindergarten and grade one, two, seven and eight. Certificates of Immunization can be obtained from the Richland County Health Department at 2000 Hampton St. (please take your shot records) or from your private physician. Parents must also have ready the student's Social Security Number and a previous report card and/or transfer sheet from the school the student is leaving.

In the case of guardianship, a copy of the document establishing the guardian relationship must be filed at the Richland School District Two Administration Office, 6832 Brookfield Road, Columbia, S.C. 29206. Enrollment will not be permitted until the appropriate guardianship has been established and the document is on file.

State-modified immunization requirements

All children in kindergarten through 10th grade must have the MMR, and booster for measles, mump and rubella. Students starting kindergarten and grades one, two, seven or eight will need to receive the hepatitis B series.

The Richland County Health Department is open Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 4:15 p.m., and appointments are recommended. For more information, call DHEC's immunization branch at (800) 27-SHOTS.





MEDICAL/ DENTAL SERVICES



Medical Care

Moncrief Army Community Hospital, Fort Jackson's main medical facility, is a 12-story medical treatment facility that operates 60 inpatient beds, 106 infirmary beds, and 30 ambulatory clinics. On an average day Moncrief provides medical care for 18 inpatients, sees 1,440 patients in its ambulatory clinics, fills 1,772 prescriptions, and performs 995 laboratory procedures and 279 radiological procedures, including nuclear medicine tests. A sophisticated hospital for its size, Moncrief Army Community Hospital works closely with the Dorn Veterans Administration Medical Center, the 20th Medical Group at Shaw AFB, and local civilian facilities to provide quality healthcare services.

TRICARE

TRICARE, the Military Healthcare System's managed care program, has been in operation in South Carolina since 1996. In partnership with the Humana Military Healthcare Services and Blue Cross/Blue Shield of South Carolina, a large, robust network of civilian providers has been established in the Columbia metropolitan area. TRICARE offers three options for eligible beneficiaries: Prime, Extra, and Standard. TRICARE Standard, formerly known as CHAMPUS, offers beneficiaries the widest choice of providers and facilities but also has the highest cost sharing requirements. Active duty family members, retirees and retiree family members are encouraged to enroll in TRICARE Prime. TRICARE Prime enrolled beneficiaries have priority for care within the Military Treatment Facility. Active duty service members assigned to Fort Jackson are required to in-process through the TRICARE Service Center to transfer their Prime enrollment and their Primary Care Manager to Moncrief Army Community Hospital.

TRICARE Service Center

The TRICARE Service Center is located within Moncrief Army Community Hospital just to the left of the main patient entrance on the hospital's ground floor. Blue Cross/Blue Shield employees staff the TRICARE Service Center and provide assistance with enrollment portability, TRICARE questions, TRICARE Prime enrollment and billing issues. Newly arriving families who are enrolled in TRICARE Prime should make the TRICARE Service Center one of their first stops when arriving to Fort Jackson. The center will provide you with information on how to access care here and what steps to take if you need emergency care or care while traveling. In addition, we have Health Benefits Advisors and the Patient Representative in the same vicinity to answer your questions and concerns.

Family Health Center

The Family Health Center (FHC) is a major primary care access point for permanent party active duty service members, their family members, and retirees and their family members who are enrolled in TRICARE Prime. Located on the ground floor to the right of the hospital's main entrance, the FHC is open from 7:20 a.m. to 8 p.m., Monday through Friday, and 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on training holidays, closed on Holidays. It is recommended that you arrive 15 minutes before your scheduled appointment time for check-in and vital signs check.

All TRICARE Prime patients are assigned a healthcare provider who serves as the patient's primary care manager

(PCM). Your PCM will provide for your healthcare needs or coordinate referrals for any healthcare services required. To make an appointment with your PCM, call 751-CARE (751-2273). Your PCM will initiate specialty referrals to other clinics throughout the hospital or within the TRICARE network as necessary.

Permanent party Soldiers may call 751-CARE (751-2273) at any time to obtain an appointment for sick call. Sick call appointments for permanent party are available throughout the day in the FHC to be as convenient as possible. An effort is made to schedule that appointment with the Soldier's PCM. There are a limited number of space-available appointments for non-Prime patients. These appointments are available by calling 751-CARE (751-2273) after 10 a.m. Monday through Friday.

Pharmacy

The Main Outpatient Pharmacy, located on the basement level of the hospital, is open from 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. To get prescriptions filled, one must have a valid identification card authorizing medical care for the person for whom the prescription was written. Copies of the mini-formulary are available in the Main Outpatient Pharmacy. For more information, call 751-2259.

Refills may be obtained at the Pharmacy Refill Annex at the Post Exchange Mall. The Refill Annex is open from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. The pharmacy offers an automated call-in refill service by calling 751-2250, with refills available for pickup at the Refill Annex within two days. The Refill Annex is not able to fill new prescriptions. In addition to Moncrief's services, beneficiaries may use the TRICARE Mail Order Pharmacy (TMOP). The TMOP enables eligible beneficiaries to obtain a 90-day supply of their medication via the postal system.

McWethy Troop Medical Clinic

McWethy Troop Medical Clinic provides healthcare to all initial entry

training Soldiers, Soldiers on temporary duty status, Reserve Component Soldiers on drill or annual training status, and any Soldier in student status assigned or attached to Fort Jackson. Located across from the hospital, McWethy Troop Medical clinic is open Monday through Saturday and holidays from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Sick call appointments are available throughout the day in the Family Health Center.

Community Mental Health Services

Located in the McWethy Troop Medical Clinic, Fort Jackson's Community Mental Health Services provides a wide range of mental health services including evaluation and treatment of emotional illness and human interaction problems. Appointments are required, but active duty Soldiers with emergencies will be seen on a walk-in basis. For information, call 751-5911.

Preventive Medicine

The Department of Preventive Medicine, serving as Fort Jackson's "Public Health Department," is located at 4323 Hill St. between Magruder and Jackson Streets. Community Health Nursing, Occupational Health, Environmental Health, Health Physics and Industrial Hygiene are all components within the Department of Preventive Medicine. They offer a wide variety of services that include Tuberculosis screening, overseas travel evaluations, HIV education, and health promotion services (e.g., tobacco cessation). In addition, Preventive Medicine conducts sanitary inspections, monitors health issues for Child Development Services, and monitors pest prevalence and communicable diseases. Occupational Health and Community Health Nursing also are components of the Preventive Medicine Service.

The Preventive Medicine Service also operates the Readiness and Wellness Center (RAWC). The RAWC offers a wealth of information on various health education and wellness issues, including

Internet access to a variety of health-related Web sites. For information, call 751-5200.

Dental Care

Fort Jackson's Dental Activity consists of five clinics providing a wide range of dental services. All clinics are open from 7:15 a.m. to 4:15 p.m., Monday through Friday. Your servicing dental clinic is dependent upon your unit of assignment. The Dental Headquarters (751-6213) is located at 3295 Forney St. Caldwell Dental Clinic (751-5178/6017), located on Strom Thurmond Boulevard, treats Basic and Advanced Training Soldiers. Hagen Dental Clinic (751-3255/4091), located near the intersection on Moseby Street and Magruder Avenue, treats permanent party and AIT Soldiers. The Oral Surgery Dental Clinic (751-2241/2108) is located on the third floor of Moncrief Army Community Hospital. The physical examination station (751-3105/3106) adjacent to the Reception Station on Washington Road primarily conducts dental in-processing for new recruits. The IRR Dental Clinic (751-4069/1786), located at 2179 Sumter Ave., conducts examinations of those IRR Soldiers returning to Active Duty. Active duty family members, retirees and their family members are seen on a space-available basis for emergency care only. Active duty family members are encouraged to enroll in the TRICARE Dental Program (TDP) and may pick up a list of the local area United Concordia providers at either Hagen or Caldwell Clinics.

TRAINING



"Victory Starts Here!"

Fort Jackson plays a major role in shaping today's U.S. Army by training almost half of tomorrow's disciplined, well-trained, professional Soldiers. With an ideal climate for year-round training, more than 45,000 Initial Entry Training Soldiers are trained here each year.

The first stop on the road to becoming a Soldier is the 120th Adjutant General Battalion (Reception), one of the finest facilities of its kind anywhere. This modern complex receives new Soldiers at any time of day or night and has the facilities to feed, house, administratively process and properly outfit the men and women beginning Army service.

Basic Combat Training

After two to five days of processing and general orientation, new Soldiers leave the 120th to begin nine challenging weeks of Basic Combat Training at either the 193rd Infantry Brigade or the 165th Infantry Brigade. To keep Soldiers motivated and focused, basic combat training is divided into three distinct phases. At the end of each phase, Soldiers must meet required standards and tasks that serve as intermediate goals toward graduation as tested in situational training exercises.

During the first, or "Red" phase, training is devoted to introductory lessons in drill and ceremony, physical training, military customs and courtesies and the wearing of the uniform. Soldiers are also taught rifle maintenance and the manual of arms, first aid, radio and field telephone communications, and are introduced to chemical, biological and nuclear warfare. They also conquer the tough Bayonet Assault Course,

Pugil Training and Victory Tower rappelling and ropes course to help build confidence and motivation.

The second, or "White" phase, focuses on intense marksmanship training that culminates with rifle qualification on a state-of-the-art computerized live firing range. After qualification, Soldiers enhance their rifle competence with instruction in advanced rifle marksmanship, a realistic and useful combat skill. During this phase map reading is also taught and several road marches are conducted.

In the final, or "Blue" phase, training is devoted to tactical and combat skills, culminating with Victory Forge, a sevenday tactical field exercise, requiring use of all the skills taught throughout Basic Combat Training. Soldiers march 10 kilometers to the field, set up defensive perimeter and tent area and learn the techniques of using field equipment. This training covers combat skills, defensive tactics, fire and maneuver, land navigation, radio communications and finishes with a 15 kilometer road march.

Recent combat in Operations Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom has resulted in the addition of many combat skills to basic training to better prepare Soldiers for the possibility of deployment in the near future. This training includes convoy operations, urban operations, checkpoint operations, media and civilians on the battlefield and other combat skills.

Woven throughout basic training and serving as the foundation for Soldier's training, are the Army's Seven Core Values and Warrior Ethos. The Core Values—Loyalty, Duty, Respect, Selfless Service, Honor, Integrity, and Personal Courage—are emphasized throughout the nine-week cycle by relating them to training events, Army heritage and teamwork development. With proper

training and application, the values become a way of life.

The Warrior Ethos is the spirit of the American Soldier. Regardless of their occupational specialty, the American Soldier is known for total commitment to victory—Mission First, Never Accept Defeat, Never Quit and Never Leave a Fallen Comrade. The Warrior Ethos is reinforced throughout basic training so that these principles gradually develop into an absolute faith in themselves and their fellow Soldiers to succeed in all they do.

Organization

Two Combat Training Brigades operate on post, each commanded by a colonel who is centrally selected by Department of the Army. There are nine active-duty lieutenant colonel commands for basic training; each capable of training 1,200 Soldiers every cycle. Basic Training was extended from eight to nine weeks in October 1998 to incorporate Army Values (human relations) Training.

Fort Jackson also conducts Advanced Individual Training (AIT) for chaplains' assistants, administrative specialists, finance specialists, and wheeled vehicle mechanics. The 369th Adjutant General Battalion, part of the Soldier Support Institute, conducts the administrative

training. The 171st Infantry Brigade's AIT battalion is the 187th Ordnance Battalion. They conduct the 63B wheeled vehicle mechanics training. In FY 06, both AIT battalions were able to provide better realistic training with the incorporation of Camp Victory. This forward operating base (FOB) is used to complete their field training.

In support of Fort Jackson's training mission are the 171st Infantry Brigade, the medical and dental activities, and a variety of other support units.

193rd Infantry Brigade

The 193rd Infantry Brigade, or "First Team," is comprised of five active component basic combat training battalions: the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Battalions, 13th Infantry Regiment; and the 2nd and 3rd Battalions, 60th Infantry Regiment. The 193rd IB also has three U.S. Army Reserve partnership units, brigades from the 80th, 95th and 108th Reserve Divisions.

1st, 2nd and 3rd Battalions, 13th Infantry Regiment, "First at Vicksburg"

The regiment was initially formed in July 1789 as the 13th Infantry Regiment. Reconstituted in May 1861, Gen. William





T. Sherman was the colonel of the regiment and Phillip Sheridan was one of the original captains.

During the Civil War, the regiment participated in the battles of Haynes Bluff, Champion Hill and Black River. During the assault on Vicksburg, May 19, 1863, the regiment earned its motto "First at Vicksburg," as the 13th Infantry Regiment was the only unit to plant its colors on the Confederate position.

On Feb. 27, 1987, the 13th Infantry Regiment was transferred to the United Army Training Center Command and reorganized at Fort Jackson. Today, the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Battalions, 13th Infantry Regiment conduct Initial Entry Training at Fort Jackson.

2nd and 3rd Battalions, 60th Infantry Regiment "Go Devil"

With distinguished combat service during World War I, World War II, and Vietnam, these two battalions—the 2nd Battalion "Scouts Out," and 3rd Battalion "To the Utmost Extent of Our Power," 60th Infantry Regiment are today located at Fort Jackson, S.C.

The 2nd Battalion was reactivated on Fort Jackson in August 1996, and the 3rd Battalion was reactivated here on Nov. 16, 2005. Both battalions of the historic "Go Devil" regiment train and prepare new Soldiers to become an integral part of America's Army.

165th Infantry Brigade

The 165th Infantry Brigade conducts gender-integrated basic combat training. The basic training units include the 1st and 3rd Battalion, 34th Infantry Regiment; the 2nd Battalion, 39th Infantry Regiment; the 1st Battalion, 61st Infantry Regiment, 3rd Battalion, 323rd Infantry Regiment; and the 2nd Battalion, 485th Infantry Regiment.

A Brigade Headquarters oversees all the units and creates a synergistic, teamconcept approach to training.

1st Battalion, 61st Infantry Regiment, "Roadrunners"

The 61st Regiment was constituted in the Regular Army on May 15, 1917, as Company A, 61st Infantry, and organized at Gettysburg National Park, Pa., on June 10, 1917. On Nov. 17, 1917, the 61st Infantry was assigned to the 5th Division. It was with the 5th Division that the unit received its first taste of combat.


The regiment deployed to Europe during World War I, where it was awarded four battle streamers for its gallant participation in the bloody campaigns of Saint Mihiel, Meuse-Argonne, Alsace and Lorraine in 1918.

Following the end of the war, the 61st returned to Camp Jackson, S.C., where it was inactivated on Sept. 2, 1921. The unit was relieved from assignment with the 5th Division and assigned to the 8th Division on Aug. 15, 1927. On Oct. 1, 1933, the 61st Infantry was relieved from assignment to the 8th Division and again assigned to the 5th Division.

The unit was disbanded Nov. 11, 1944. On Aug. 10, 1950, the 61st Infantry was reconstituted in the Regular Army as Company A, 61st Infantry, an element of the 8th Infantry Division. It was activated on Aug. 17, 1950, at Fort Jackson, S.C.

After a period of activation, inactivation and reassignments spanning over a period of 18 years, the unit was once again inactivated in September 1956 at Fort Carson, Colo., and was concurrently relieved from assignment to the 8th Infantry Division. On Jan. 17, 1962, Company A, 61st Infantry was re-designated as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 1st Battalion, 61st Infantry Regiment. HHC 1-61 Infantry was assigned to the 5th Infantry Division and activated at Fort Carson, Colo., (organic elements constituted and activated) on Feb. 19, 1962. The unit was reassigned to the 4th Infantry on Aug. 2, 1971, and assigned back to the 5th Division Aug. 21, 1974. HHC 1-61 was inactivated on June 19, 1989, at Fort Polk, La., and relieved from assignment to the 5th Infantry Division.

The unit received several awards and decorations during the Vietnam conflict, which include the Valorous Unit Award, two Republic of Vietnam Cross of Gallantry awards and a Civil Action Honor Medal. After reorganizing again for the Korean and Vietnam conflicts, the unit



was transferred to the U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command and organized at Fort Jackson on June 13, 1993, to fulfill its current role in conducting Basic Combat Training for initial entry Soldiers.

2nd Battalion, 39th Infantry Regiment, "Fighting Falcons"

The 39th Infantry Regiment was organized at Camp Syracuse, N.Y., June 1, 1917, by transfer of veteran troops from the 30th Infantry Regiment. In December, the 39th was assigned to the 4th Infantry Division and in the spring of 1918, sailed for France as part of the American Expeditionary Force in World War I. The regiment distinguished itself in the key Alsne-Marne, Champagne, St. Mihiel, Lorraine and Muesse-Argonne campaigns, earning its famous nickname "Fighting Falcons."

During the lull between wars, the regimental crest was designed and approved. Each of the devices in the crest holds significant meaning for the regiment. The shield is blue for infantry. The fleur-de-lis is from the coat of arms of Soissons, a town in France recaptured by the 39th Regiment in 1918. The two trees represent the Groves of Cresnes, the sight of the regiment's first military success in France during World War I. The boar's head on the canton is taken from the crest of the 30th Infantry Regiment and indicates the 39th was organized with personnel from the 30th Infantry Regiment. The crest is a falcon's head, for Mount Faucon in Muesse-Argonne. The falcon holds, in its bill, an ivy leaf from the shoulder sleeve insignia of the 4th Infantry Division to which the regiment was assigned during World War I. The motto "D'une Vaillance Admirable" is a quotation from the French citation, which awarded the Croix de Guerre with Gilt Star to the regiment for its distinguished service in World War I. The motto best translates—"With a Military Courage Worthy of Admiration."

The 39th Infantry Regiment was reactivated Aug. 1, 1940, and became the first unit of U.S. combat troops to set foot on foreign soil when they stormed the beaches of Algiers in November 1942. During fighting in Sicily, Italy, the regiment came under the command of the legendary Col. Harry A. "Paddy" Flint, who gave the regiment its triple A-Bar Nothing slogan—Anything, Anywhere, Anytime—Bar Nothing.

The regiment took great pride in the AAA-O slogan, displaying it on their helmets and vehicles, even in combat. Later in the war, the 39th landed at Utah Beach and fought through France. The Fighting Falcons joined the 47th Infantry Regiment in capturing Roetgen, the first German town to fall in World War II.

After a series of inactivations and activations spanning a 20-year period, the 2nd Battalion, 39th Infantry Regiment was reactivated on Feb. 1, 1966, as part of the 9th Infantry Division and in late 1966 it deployed for combat in the Republic of Vietnam.

For its part in World Wars I, II and the Vietnam conflict, the 39th Infantry Regiment possesses 21 battle streamers. Its decorations include four Presidential

Unit Citations, four French Croix de Guerre (two with Palm and one with Gilt Star) and the Belgian Fourager.

Following reactivation and transfer to the TRADOC, the 2nd Battalion, 39th Infantry Regiment departed Fort Dix, N.J., for Fort Jackson, S.C., arriving on Aug. 22, 1990. The battalion is justifiably proud of its historic past and today continues to uphold these same high standards of excellence in Basic Combat Training as it prepares young men and women for service to their nation. Anything, Anywhere, Anytime . . . Bar Nothing!

1st Battalion and 3rd Battalion, 34th Infantry Regiment, "Levte Dragons"

The 34th Infantry Regiment was constituted July 1, 1916, in the Regular Army. It was organized in El Paso, Texas, on July 15, 1916, by transfer of personnel from the 7th, 20th and 23rd Infantry Regiments. Its initial mission included guard duty on the Mexican border and the training of National Guard units.

During World War I, the 34th was shipped to France, arriving Aug. 27,

1918. On Oct. 9, 1918, the regiment held the extreme left of the 7th Infantry Division's flank. The regiment received battle honors "Lorraine" for actions during this period.

In World War II, the 34th Infantry was chosen to spearhead the assault on Leyte, to liberate the Philippines. The unit was in a series of bloody battles for 78 continuous days. The 1st Battalion, 34th Infantry Regiment received the Presidential Unit Citation for conspicuous valor and outstanding performance. The battalion's nickname, "Leyte Dragons," derives its recognition during the Leyte assault.

The 34th Infantry Regiment made its second beachhead assault in the Philippines on the island of Luzon. It was later chosen to assault the island of Corregidor. On June 30, 1950, in the Republic of Korea, the 34th Infantry Regiment, with the 24th Infantry Division, began to successfully delay the North Korean People's Army until the United Nations forces could arrive to hold the Pusan Perimeter.

The 1st Battalion, 34th Infantry Regiment was deactivated on Jan. 15, 1993, and was reactivated on Jan. 12, 1996, at Fort Jackson. Following periods as a Reserve and inactive unit, the 3rd Battalion, 34th Infantry Regiment resumed active duty as a Basic Combat Training unit.


Advanced Individual Training

Chances are that Soldiers remaining here for advanced individual training (AIT), the second and final step during initial entry training, may receive all their training while assigned to one brigade.

The 187th Ordnance Battalion, 171st Infantry Brigade, is the only AIT battalion in the Army that trains light- and heavywheel vehicle organizational mechanics.

The 369th Adjutant General Battalion is responsible for conducting the Soldier Support Institute's AIT mission in several administrative military occupational specialties.

AIT is actually an integration of the attitudes, skills and knowledge necessary to become a proficient Soldier in today's





Army. The process begins by merging the newly acquired Soldier skills learned in basic combat training with the teachings of an MOS. These are then integrated into simulated mission settings.

Graduation

Graduation from Basic Combat Training or Advanced Individual Training is a good time to celebrate a Soldier's accomplishments.

Detailed schedules of graduation events are available from the Soldier's unit/company. Highlights of the Soldier's unit/company training experience are presented in an orientation provided by the unit/company on Thursday before graduation on Friday. Following the orientation, a buffet dinner will be available on Fort Jackson.

Family and friends may visit with their Soldier in the company area until 8 p.m. Graduation is held outdoors at Hilton Field in good weather, or indoors at the Community Activities Center in inclement weather. Graduating Soldiers may be signed out "on pass" after graduation so

families are free to explore the activities Fort Jackson and the Columbia area have to offer.

Return times must be met so that Soldiers can proceed as scheduled to the next training location or assignment.

Travel Assistance

Victory Travel is a good source of information and assistance when planning your visit. Victory Travel can make reservations at discount rates for motels and car rentals. The office also applies "User Forms" that allow civilians access to Fort Jackson entertainment areas, brochures and tickets for Columbia-area attractions, maps of the fort and the local area, and information. Accommodations

Motel accommodations may be available at the Palmetto Lodge on post. Availability will vary as the Palmetto Lodge serves as temporary quarters for newly arrived permanent party Soldiers and their families. For more information, call 731-4779/3205.

More than 40 motels and hotels offer accommodations in the Columbia area with more than half within six miles of Fort Jackson and the remainder easily accessible via interstates and other main roads.

MAJOR UNITS, DIRECTORATES & STAFF



171st Infantry Brigade

171st Infantry Brigade is the largest permanent party command on Fort Jackson. The brigade includes Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC) Soldiers as well as Forces Command (FORSCOM) Soldiers. The brigade provides administrative command and control to the Soldiers assigned to Fort Jackson's Headquarters and special staff sections.

The brigade also assists drill sergeants and company commanders from the basic combat training battalions in conducting specialized and tactical instruction, including map reading, first aid, rifle marksmanship and communications training as well as combat indoctrination training.

171st Infantry Brigade has assigned the subject-matter experts key in TRADOC's Initial Entry Training strategy and maintains first-class, state-of-the-art training ranges using computerized scoring systems.

171st Infantry Brigade consists of: the Victory Support Battalion; 120th Adjutant General Reception Battalion; 187th Ordinance Battalion; Victory University, consisting of the Pre-Command Course and the Company Commander/First Sergeant Course; and the United States Army Drill Sergeant School. (Note: Under the proposed Fort Jackson Center of Excellence concept, the pre-command course, Victory University and the Drill Sergeant School will no longer fall under 171st Infantry Brigade.) Within these five distinct elements of 171st Infantry Brigade, thousands of Soldiers are serviced and trained every day.

187th Ordnance Battalion, "Geared to Maintain"

The 187th Ordnance Battalion was first constituted May 1, 1936, in the Regular Army as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 3rd Battalion, 54th Quartermaster

Regiment and was activated April 1, at Fort Custer, Mich. The unit was re-designated on Oct. 7, 1942, as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 187th Ordnance Heavy Maintenance Battalion, but was inactivated in 1945.

As a result of the U.S. Army Regimental System, the headquarters was transferred in 1987 to the TRADOC. Originally assigned to the 4th Training Brigade at the U.S. Army Training Center at Fort Jackson, it was activated and organized for its present training mission with 171st Infantry Brigade of producing specialists in light and heavy wheeled vehicle repair and additional skills in vehicle recovery.

The 187th Ordnance Battalion is the only unit in TRADOC that trains and produces apprentice level Light Wheel Vehicle (63B MOS - 10 weeks) and Heavy Wheel Vehicle (63S MOS - nine weeks) mechanics for the operational Army.

Once Soldiers graduate from the 63B or 63S AIT courses, they are able to perform unit-level maintenance in the areas of troubleshooting, fuel systems, electrical systems, power trains, chassis/suspension and steering systems, brake systems and Preventive Maintenance Checks and Service.

The 187th Ordnance Battalion also operates one of only three additional skill identifier courses in TRADOC that awards the "H8" recovery specialist identifier for Soldiers in the active National Guard and enlisted Reserve Component forces.

Victory Support Battalion

Victory Support Battalion was originally established as Task Force Victory on Jan. 1, 1998, and activated as it currently stands on July 29, 2005. Victory Support Battalion was established from units assigned/attached to the 171st Infantry Brigade. Its mission includes the

Headquarters, Fort Jackson and its mission related staff sections that support Fort Jackson's Initial Entry Training Mission. Task Force Victory consists of Company A; Company B; the 282nd Army "Victory" Band; United States Army Student Detachment, and the 748th Ordnance Company, Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD). Victory Support Battalion is the largest and most diverse unit on Fort Jackson, serving multiple missions on Fort Jackson and all over the world.

Task Force Marshall

Task Force Marshall, named in honor of citizen-soldier and trainer General

George C. Marshall, was formed with the sole mission of providing basic skills refresher training to mobilized Individual Ready Reserve Soldiers.

TFM is a battalion-sized training force comprised of mobilized U.S. Army Reserve units from North Carolina, Kentucky, Virginia and Louisiana. TFM head-quarters is comprised of command and control elements originally from the 1/518th Regiment, 108th Division (Institutional Training) from Asheville, N.C., and operates now as a member of 171st Infantry Brigade, United States Army Training Center & Fort Jackson. TFM is based at Camp McCrady, S.C.



Alpha Company/Victory Support Battalion

Alpha Company provides post training and support by providing personnel to the Installation Command Group; Staff Judge Advocate; Inspector General, G3; 171st Infantry Brigade; Victory Support Battalion, and other staff sections on the installation.

Bravo Company/Victory Support Battalion

Bravo Company provides direct support of the Fort Jackson mission of training Soldiers. This company provides personnel to serve as range cadre on all installation Basic Rifle Marksmanship Ranges, Combat Indoctrination Ranges, and instructors for the General Subjects Committee. Every Soldier trained on Fort Jackson is instructed and supported by the members of Bravo Company as they work in conjunction with Basic and Advanced Individual Training Battalions to ensure the Army receives the best trained Warriors in the world.

282nd Army "Victory" Band/ Victory Support Battalion

One of Fort Jackson's most colorful units, the 282nd U.S. Army "Victory" Band, provides countless hours of entertainment for military and civilian audiences throughout the area. Comprised of some 40 Soldier-musicians, the band can provide a marching, stage or concert band, or a small combo. Its major function is to provide musical support for all military ceremonies, such as basic combat training graduations, retirement reviews, command retreats and other functions that are part of the installation routine. The band also participates in festivals and other civilian functions throughout South Carolina, North Carolina and Georgia in support of community relations and Army recruiting programs.

United States Army Student Detachment/ Victory Support Battalion

The United States Army Student Detachment (USASD) provides command



and control to more than 1,500 senior Army officers attending civilian colleges and universities worldwide, including the Air and Naval War Colleges and the Command and Staff Colleges. They also support those officers and enlisted personnel serving in the Training with Industry program. USASD is the direct link between the student, the military personnel center, and the Army Finance community.

748th Ordnance Company, Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD)

The 748th Explosive Ordnance Disposal unit, attached to Fort Jackson since 1956, serves the state of South Carolina and Fort Gordon, Ga. The 748th EOD provides service to the installation as well as to law enforcement agencies throughout its area of operations to render safe and dispose of any hazardous military explosive material. In addition, it also handles all military chemical and nuclear ordnance and responds to incidents that involve improvised explosive devices. The 23 member unit also provides training seminars for military and civilian law enforcement agencies, and often assists the Secret Service and State Department in providing protective security for the president, vice president, foreign heads of state and other VIPs who visit the area. The 748th EOD maintains a response team on a 24-hour basis year-round.

120th Adjutant General Battalion (Reception)

This battalion receives basic combat training recruits, processes them into the Army, begins the Soldierization process and sends them on to one of Fort Jackson's training battalions. The battalion also conducts pre-basic combat fitness training for new Soldiers who do not meet the minimum physical fitness standards to enter basic combat training. Last, the reception battalion processes prior service Soldiers back into the Army. The 120th Adjutant General Battalion (Reception) consists of a Headquarters Company, Company A, Company B, Company C, Company D and the Fitness Training Company (FTC), which supports basic training and advanced individual training in both the Fitness Training Unit (FTU) and the Physical Therapy and Rehabilitation Program (PTRP).

Center of Excellence

Victory University

Victory University, established in 1998, is assigned to 171st Infantry Brigade. It is comprised of the TRADOC Pre-Command Course and the United States Army Drill Sergeant School. Victory University's primary mission is training the U.S. Army initial entry training Brigade, Battalion and Company

Commanders, Command Sergeants Majors and First Sergeants, and staff members for duty in both basic combat training and advanced individual training units across the United States.

Pre-Command Course

Fort Jackson is the home of Training and Doctrine Command's (TRADOC) Pre-Command Course, an intensive two-week seminar designed to assist senior officers and noncommissioned officers selected for TRADOC battalion or brigade commands. These future commanders receive instruction designed to prepare them for the unique challenges encountered in the Initial Entry Training environment.

The Cadre Training Course provides similar instruction tailored to company grade officers and senior noncommissioned officers who will serve in company leadership positions. The Cadre Training Course is taught either in-house or by mobile training teams, which are available to TRADOC units throughout the continental United States.

United States Army Drill Sergeant School

Established in 1964, Fort Jackson's U.S. Army Drill Sergeant School became permanently coeducational in 1972. Students undergo a rigorous, nine-week course, which provides them with the knowledge and motivation needed to function as drill sergeants.

This training includes leadership instruction, stress management, drill and ceremony physical readiness training, basic rifle marksmanship, combat skills, and other general military subjects.

Headquarters, U.S. Army Garrison, Installation Management Agency

The Fort Jackson Garrison is commanded by an Army colonel, and is under the command and control of the U.S. Army Installation Management Agency—Southeast Region, which is located at Fort McPherson (Atlanta), Ga.

Garrison/Installation Directorates and Staff

Fort Jackson's installation support functions are provided by the United States Army Garrison and like all Army installations operate under the direction of the Installation Management Command. The Garrison commander reports to the director, Southeast Region, Installation Management Command and the commanding general in his role as installation commander. The installation has a wide range of support directorates and activities with the mission of supporting the community's objectives. Each directorate or activity plays a key part in conducting the business of Fort Jackson.

Civilian Personnel Advisory Center (CPAC)

CPAC provides advisory services related to labor relations, management, employee relations, Workers' Compensation, and recruitment and position management/classification. Vacancy announcements and applications for appropriated fund jobs are available on the Internet at www.cpol.army.mil and www.usajobs.opm.gov. The CPAC is located at 5450 Strom Thurmond Blvd., Room 229. Call 751-3219 for information.

Directorate of Contracting

Located in Building 4340 on Hill and Magruder Streets, the Directorate of Contracting (DoC) provides purchasing/contracting support for supplies services and construction to installation and satellite activities. The DoC also performs the planning soliciting execution and administration of supplies, services, and construction procurements. Part of its mission includes ensuring that all



statutory requirements are met and providing mobilization planning and support. For information about DoC, call 751-4140.

Directorate of Information Management

The Directorate of Information Management (DoIM) is located at 4282 Jackson Blvd. DoIM is responsible for managing, fielding and sustaining leading-edge information technologies on the installation. The management staff also establishes policy and enforces information-processing standards as part of the Army's integration of new and modernized systems. This directorate's operational mission includes a integrated information processing center, which facilitates worldwide telecommunications services, operation of an extensive local area network, a full-service telephone operation, a records holding facility and an official mail and distribution center.

Directorate of Logistics and Engineering

The mission of the Directorate of Logistics and Engineering (DLE) is to provide logistical and engineering support including contingency plans, laundry, food service program, consolidated installation property book, supplies and service, maintenance of material, movement of material and personnel to the installation and satellite activities, planning and executing the engineering

functions and real property maintenance and environmental, recycling and natural resources management. DLE also designs and supervises matters pertaining to master plans, operation and maintenance, and is responsible for 1,260 units of family housing. The directorate plays a vital role in the installation's energy conservation program. DLE is located at 2600 Lee Road. For more information about DLE, call 751-7640.

Directorate of Human Resources

The Directorate of Human Resources (DHR) encompasses the Adjutant General (AG) Division, Army Community Education Services (ACES), Records Management (RM), Army Substance Abuse Program (ASAP) and the Army Career and Alumni Program (ACAP). All activities, except ACES, RM, ASAP and ACAP, of the DHR are located in Building 5450 on Strom Thurmond Boulevard. Normal office hours are Monday through Friday, from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; ID Card Section hours are from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.; ACES hours are from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; RM hours are from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; ASAP hours are from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and ACAP hours are from 7:30 a.m. to 4:15 p.m. DHR is responsible for providing technical oversight and an integrated Human Resources Management Program support for Fort Jackson and tenant organizations assigned to Fort Jackson. The AG Division manages and provides policy guidance on officer, warrant officer, and enlisted personnel actions. AG personnel assist the military community in career planning, retiree support, casualty management, and congressional/special correspondence. For more information, call 751-6062.

Directorate of Plans, Training and Mobilization and Security (DPTMS)

DPTMS coordinates and supervises planning operations, training activities, ceremonies, aviation support, security functions, museum activities, force integration and mobilization aspects, training aids, audiovisual/graphics and support activities, and (when assigned) Reserve Component support matters. DPTMS is located on Sumter Street in Building 2179. For more information on DPTMS, call 751-7523.

Directorate of Resource Management (DRM) - GARRISON

Located in Building 2600, on the corner of Lee and Washington, the DRM maintains staff responsibility for both financial and manpower resources in accordance with FM 100-22, Installation Management for the Fort Jackson Garrison. DRM directs and coordinates program and budget formulation, execution and control; serves as liaison and manages installation resource matters; supports organizational management; manages and

coordinates manpower and equipment programs; manages the Army Travel Card Program, Defense Travel System (DTS) Program, Combined Federal Campaign (CFC), Bank Liaison and the Installation Internal Review Program. For more information on DRM, call 751-1428.

Inspector General

The mission of the Inspector General is to enhance mission readiness by inquiring and reporting into matters of mission performance, discipline, morale, efficiency and economy. The IG conducts and reports upon inspections required by law and regulation or directed by the commanding general.

Additionally, the IG receives and acts on requests for assistance from Soldiers, family members and DOD civilians and answers inquiries made to the 751-FAIR hotline. The IG office is located at 2562 Essayons Way. Office hours are Monday through Friday, from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. For more information on the IG, call 751-5580.

Directorate of Emergency Services

Assigned to the office of the Garrison Commander and comprised of Soldiers, civilian employees and the support personnel. DES is located in the Emergency Service Center (Building 5499) on the corner of Jackson Boulevard and Hill Street. The directorate's organizational

structure includes the Provost Marshal's Office (PMO), 17th Military Police Detachment, Fort Jackson Fire Department and the Emergency 911 Center.

Provost Marshal's Office (PMO)

The Provost Marshal's Office is part of the Directorate of Emergency Services and is assigned to the office of the garrison commander. It is comprised of military police Soldiers, Department of the Army police officers, contract security guards, civilian employees and support personnel. The PMO performs a myriad of duties and functions including vehicle registration, police administration, traffic accident investigations, Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS), Drug Awareness Resistance Education (DARE), civil liaison and AWOL apprehension, Military Police Investigations (MPI), military working dogs (MWD), game warden, installation access control, physical security, crime prevention, lost and found property and investigating and reporting criminal activity on the installation.

The PMO plays an integral role in the successful outcome of a multitude of post-wide events such as weekly graduations and the yearly Torch Light Tattoo celebration by managing the flow of traffic and parking during these events. The PMO is the focal point in promoting traffic safety on the installation by routinely conducting sobriety and contraband checkpoints, speed enforcement operations, and conducting random gate searches.

The MWD section assists units and organizations on the installation with health and welfare inspections, building searches for unsecured buildings and other such requests as needed. With an emphasis on community support and safety for resident Soldiers and their families, the PMO provides bicycle patrols in the housing areas using assets from COPS and provides an active DARE program to the DoD schools on Fort Jackson.

911 Center

The 911 Center is staffed by full-time, enhanced 911 dispatchers who receive



all calls for the need of emergency response pertaining to any fire, police or emergency medical situation. They also dispatch all appropriate response units to a call and act as the communications focal point for all operations performed at an emergency scene.

Fire Prevention & Protection Division

The Fort Jackson Fire Department, located in the Emergency Services Center, maintains 10 pieces of fire apparatus with a continuous staffing of firefighters on duty 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. The Operations Branch is responsible for responding to all fires, chemical releases/spills, and medical emergencies in support of Moncrief Hospital, natural disasters and any type of rescue situation. They also provide community education in first-aid. CPR and AED use. A fire prevention staff of fire inspectors performs fire inspections of all post facilities, ensures fire code enforcement in new construction projects and educates various groups in fire safety matters.

17th Military Police Detachment

Assigned to the Fort Jackson Directorate of Emergency Services (DES), the Military Police Company, consisting of both military police and administrative logistical personnel, supports the PMO by performing administrative/logistical functions.

Public Affairs

The Public Affairs Office is responsible for providing a comprehensive Public Affairs program in support of the commands, units and organizations located on, operationally assigned to, or associated with the installation. Divided into three sections, Public Information, Command Information, and Community Relations, the public affairs staff is a key asset for the commander to accurately project and convey information.

The Fort Jackson Leader, a weekly commercial-enterprise Army newspaper with a circulation of 15,000, is published

and distributed each Thursday. Information for the newspaper's standing column, "Community Highlights," must be submitted by noon the Monday before publication. Story ideas are always welcome. Plans, Analysis, and Integration Office

The Plans, Analysis, and Integration Office (PAIO) provides oversight of assigned programs; conducts analytical reviews; monitors Army baseline standards; captures and enables implementation of best business practices; identifies, tracks and orchestrates reporting of performance measures; and integrates and optimizes use of current reporting systems. The PAIO is the Garrison Commander's focal point for strategy and management planning for the installation. The PAIO is currently located in Building 4354 on Hardee Street (directly behind Post Conference Room).

Installation Safety Office

Located at 3290 Forney St., the Installation Safety Office is responsible for staff oversight of the Safety and Occupational Health Program, as well as the integration of Composite Risk Management into operations and training. The Safety Office identifies hazards and recommends mitigation measures for the elimination or reduction of risk. Customers that wish to report hazards anonymously may call the Safety Hotline at 751-SAFE (7233). The Safety Office also provides Risk Management and Safety training for a wide variety of topics, including Hazard Communication and Motorcycle Safety training. All questions or requests may be directed to the Safety Office switchboard at 751-6004.

Equal Opportunity Staff Office

The Equal Opportunity Staff Office (EOSO) mission is to formulate, direct and sustain a comprehensive effort to

maximize human potential and to ensure fair treatment for all based solely on merit, fitness and capability, which supports readiness. EO advisers conduct inquiries into allegations of race, color, religion, gender or national origin discrimination and sexual harassment for Soldiers, civilian employees and their families. U.S. Army Soldier Support Institute

The U.S. Army Soldier Support Institute (SSI) was established in July 1973, at Fort Benjamin Harrison, Ind., as the U.S. Army Institute of Administration (AIA). AIA became the training component of the U.S. Army Administration Center (ADMINCEN), one of three combat and training development integrating centers assigned to the U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC). ADMINCEN became the TRADOC focal point for Army missions related to pay, personnel and administration, military justice, religious activities, medical services, public affairs and foreign language training. In 1980, ADMINCEN was reorganized into the U.S. Army Soldier Support Center (SSC), gaining mission responsibility for the "human dimension" of military operations doctrine and training aimed at improving the foundations of military leadership and ethics and increasing Soldier performance and unit cohesion.

With the establishment of SSC, the Institute of Administration was reorganized into the U.S. Army Institute of Personnel and Resource Management (IPRM). The resulting organization consisted of five directorates and four separately identified schools the U.S. Army Adjutant General School, U.S. Army Finance School, and the Computer Science and Personnel Management Schools. In January 1983, two schools were forged out of training missions assigned to the Personnel Management School—the U.S. Army Recruiting and Retention School and the U.S. Army Community Activities School. Just over one year later, in July 1984, three additional Army schools were added to the roster to bring the total number of IPRM schools to eight. The new schools included the Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) School, the Soldier Physical Fitness School, and the Army Element of the School of Music at Little Creek, Va. Subsequently, USAIPRM was reinstituted as the U.S. Army Soldier Support Institute to reflect

its newfound missions. In 1987, SSI leadership established a Noncommissioned Officer Academy to provide leadership training for senior enlisted specialists from the personnel service support mission area.

A reorganization of the Training and Doctrine Command's combat development community in 1990 disestablished the Soldier Support Center and merged its integrating mission with the Logistics Center at Fort Lee, Va. The merger of Army logistics and personnel service support missions culminated in the establishment of the Combined Arms Support Command (CASCOM) in October 1990. Under the reorganization, SSI became one of many TRADOC schools that formed the training base of the new CASCOM. Following on the heels of the 1990 TRADOC reorganization, the Base Closure and Realignment Commission in April 1991 nominated Fort Benjamin Harrison for closure and the transfer of the SSI to Fort Jackson. The transfer began officially in October 1994 and was completed on Sept. 30, 1995.

Located in Gates-Lord Hall on the corner of Hampton Parkway and Lee Road, SSI provides military training and doctrinal, force structure and equipment development programs that anticipate and address the human resource and financial management needs of America's armed forces, committed to military operations along the full spectrum of conflict. USASSI is a subordinate organization of the U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command and includes the U.S. Army Recruiting and Retention School, the U.S. Army Adjutant General School, the U.S. Army Finance School, the Army School of Music (Little Creek, Va.) and the Noncommissioned Officer Academy (NCOA). The NCOA is located in Mabry Hall at the corner of Bragg Street and Jackson Boulevard. The

NCOA provides enlisted leadership training for Soldiers holding military occupational specialties in the administrative, financial, recruiting and retention, legal and religious areas of Army operations.

The U.S. Army Recruiting and Retention School (RRS) trains commissioned and noncommissioned officers charged with meeting manpower requirements for both the active and reserve components of the Army. The RRS offers courses of instruction that train NCOs for assignment as recruiters or career counselors and prepares officers to assume company or battalion command within the U.S. Army Recruiting Command. The school also is the Army-wide proponent for the Recruiting and Retention Career Management Field. Ultimately, the RRS is responsible for imparting the special skills required to man America's all-volunteer force.

The Adjutant General and Finance schools are "home" to their respective Army branches, the Adjutant General Corps and the Finance Corps. The two branch schools offer the Officer Basic Course (OBC) for newly commissioned lieutenants and the Captain's Career Course (CCC) for first lieutenants and captains in their third or fourth year of commissioned service, advanced technical training for personnel warrant officers, and Advanced Individual Training (AIT) for enlisted Soldiers in the personnel, administration, finance and legal specialties. As Chief of Army Bands, the commandant of the Adjutant General School also oversees the training and combat developments of the Army band program at the Army School of Music. The Adjutant General School's Interservice Postal Training Activity (IPTA) trains enlisted Soldiers and noncommissioned officers from all of America's military services in modern postal operations.

USASSI branch schools are also responsible for human resources and financial management combat developments that determine both the means and methods by which Army personnel and finance specialists will operate on the battlefields of



the 21st century. All told, the various agencies of the U.S. Army Soldier Support Institute train Department of Defense civilians, military personnel from all services, and students from allied nations around the world. SSI staff and faculty offer training instruction to an annual student population in excess of 19,000.

369th Adjutant General Battalion (SSI)

The 369th Adjutant General Battalion traces its lineage back to the campaigns in the Pacific Theater during World War II. Activated in November 1943 at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, as the 74th Replacement Battalion, the unit was comprised of Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment and four replacement companies. The unit saw action in the Western Pacific while performing the mission of processing replacements and battle casualties for the combat divisions of the 10th Army. For its support of the 10th Army operations during the invasion of the Ryukyu Islands and Okinawa, the 74th was awarded the Meritorious Unit Commendation with battle streamer. After cessation of hostilities, the 74th was inactivated in March 1946.


In June 1947, the unit was re-designated as the 369th Replacement Battalion, Organized Reserve Corps, and assigned to the 3rd Army. In July 1947, the 369th was activated at Fort Jackson and remained in this status until it was inactivated again on Aug. 1, 1950. Almost 37 years later, the unit was returned to the active Army force when it was reactivated as the 369th AG Battalion May 30, 1987.

The 369th AG Battalion conducts AIT for enlisted Soldiers striving to achieve technical and tactical competence in personnel, administration, legal, and finance MOSs.

Although focused primarily on specialized technical training, the 369th also concerns itself with the whole Soldier, strengthening combat survival skills and providing young Soldiers with instructions in human relations, Army values and branch heritage.

U.S. Army Chaplain Center and School

The United States Army Chaplain Center and School was created in 1917 to train chaplains for service in World War I. Chaplain (Maj.) Aldred A. Pruden developed the plan for the school. On Feb. 9,



1918, the War Department approved Chaplain Pruden's plan, and the first session of the Chaplain School commenced March 3, 1918 at Fort Monroe, Va. Since then, the school has moved 16 times, the last move from Fort Monmouth, N.J., in 1996. The school is located in Building 10100 on Lee Road.

The school's mission is the training of chaplains and chaplain assistants who provide for the free exercise of religion for Soldiers and their family members. One chaplain and one chaplain assistant, at minimum, compose a Unit Ministry Team. The school conducts basic and advanced officer training for active and reserve-component U.S. and allied nation chaplains. The 13-week Chaplain Officer Basic Course trains ordained civilian clergy and seminarian students to be military chaplains. Upon

graduation from this course, these Soldiers are assigned as battalion chaplains or return to their active, Reserve or National Guard units.

The six-month Chaplain Captain Career Course (C4) trains chaplains who have served in at least two assignments either stateside or overseas, enhancing leadership and supervisory skills and abilities and prepares them to function as brigade chaplains. For reserve component C4 students, the training encompasses both distance and resident education. Division-level and installation chaplain courses are also offered, as well as the Chaplain Resource Manager Course and the Non-appropriated Chaplain Fund Clerk Course.

The school also provides training for chaplain assistants (56M) at the Advanced Individual Training level

(seven-week course). Specific tasks for the chaplain assistant MOS track for the basic and advanced NCO courses are taught as part of the Soldier Support Institute's NCO Academy training.

As part of TRADOC, the school develops concepts and doctrine and produces doctrinal literature for religious support. The proponent for chaplain training is the Chief of Chaplains, located in Washington, D.C.

The facility contains the U.S. Army Chaplain Center and School Library, a primary research center for Army chaplains. The school employs a branch historian and also houses the U.S. Army Chaplain Museum, a repository for artifacts relating to the history of chaplains and chaplain assistants. DoD Polygraph Institute

The original Army Polygraph School was established in 1951 as part of the Provost Marshal General School at Fort Gordon, Ga. In September 1962, the Provost Marshal School was re-designated the U.S. Army Military Police School. The Polygraph School transferred with the Military Police School to Fort McClellan, Ala., in 1975. In 1986, the Department of Defense Polygraph Institute (DoDPI) was established as a higher education and research facility with the Secretary of the Army serving as the Executive Agent. In 1991, the authority, direction and control for DoDPI were placed under the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Command, Control, Communication and Intelligence (C3I). Fiscal responsibility of DoDPI was transferred to the Defense Investigative Service (now Defense Security Service) in 1996. With the closing of Fort McClellan in 1999, DoDPI relocated to Fort Jackson, S.C. In December 2002 DoDPI was integrated into the Counterintelligence Field Activity (CIFA) whose headquarters are in Crystal City, Va.

The Institute provides initial education for all federal polygraph examiners, taught at the graduate level. In January 2003, DoDPI was accredited by the Accrediting Council for Independent Colleges and Schools to award a Certificate of Graduate Study in Forensic Psychophysiological Detection of Deception. Through agreement with Argosy University, DoDPI graduates may transfer up to 15 semester hours of graduate study from DoDPI toward a Master of Arts degree in the Argosy University's Forensic Psychology program. The Institute trains approximately 90-100 students in its 520-hour Psychophysiological Detection of Deception (PDD) Course each year.

DoDPI also offers an array of specialized courses in credibility assessment through its continuing education program. The Institute provides these courses for approximately 600 examiners annually. In addition, DoDPI maintains a continuing education certification program to ensure that the education offered by the Institute is constantly updated and provided so that examiners can meet their minimum education requirements. All federal PDD examiners are required to complete 80 hours of continuing education every two years.

In 1996, the Assistant Secretary of Defense (C3I) initiated a quality assurance program for the DoD through DoDPI, which was subsequently extended by agreement to non-DoD federal agencies. The Institute coordinated development of

minimum standards with the federal PDD program managers for quality control procedures and established a program to monitor compliance. The Quality Assurance Program not only assures these standards are consistently applied throughout the federal government, but supports PDD program managers by providing them with information that can be used to improve their programs.

DoDPI's scientific mission originated with the Defense Authorization Act of 1986, which directed the Secretary of Defense to carry out research in PDD. The mission to complete the congressionally mandated research was assigned to DoDPI. The DoDPI research program focuses on (1) developing new PDD techniques, instrumentation and analytic methods to improve PDD technology; (2) conducting research on PDD countermeasures; and (3) evaluating the validity of PDD techniques. DoDPI conducts and monitors all internal and external research pertaining to credibility assessment for the federal government.

A DoDPI Executive Committee consists of the program managers for PDD operations within the federal government and is chaired by a representative of the Deputy Under Secretary of Defense (CI&S). It advises the DoDPI director on curriculum and research



matters. DoD members of this committee include representatives from the Air Force Office of Special Investigations, the Defense Criminal Investigative Service, the Defense Intelligence Agency, the Defense Security Service, the National Reconnaissance Office, the National Security Agency, the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency, the Naval Criminal Investigative Service, the U.S. Army Criminal Investigations Command, and the U.S. Army Military Intelligence Command. Members from other federal agencies include representatives from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives; the Central Intelligence Agency; the Department of Energy; the Department of Justice; the Drug Enforcement Agency; the Federal Bureau of Investigation; the Food and Drug Administration; the Internal Revenue Service; the Transportation Security Administration; the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement; the U.S. Postal Service; and the U.S. Secret Service.

Security Investigations

The U.S. Army Military Personnel Center's Personnel Security Screening Program Detachment handles security investigations for Soldiers entering the Army at Fort Jackson for duty in sensitive security positions and military occupational specialties.

Criminal Investigation Command

Fort Jackson's 37th MP Detachment (CID) investigates felony crimes committed by or against the installation's Soldiers and civilians, on and off post, to include property crimes of high dollar value. The detachment also performs logistical security missions at area ports, protective services for high-ranking Department of the Army and DoD officials, and deploys agents worldwide in support of Army operations.

The special agents assigned to this office are the counterparts of other federal law enforcement agents and civilian



detectives. Fort Jackson's CID office has geographic responsibility for the 31 southeastern counties of South Carolina, and the majority of northwestern North Carolina counties to include Charlotte.

Defense Reutilization and Marketing Office

The Defense Reutilization and Marketing Office stores, reuses, recycles and sells government surplus. Located at 1902 Ewell Road, DRMO conducts monthly auction sales open to the public. Property may be inspected three days prior to the auction from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Property is offered for sale on an as-is basis. For more information, call 751-7716.

Military Entrance Processing Station (MEPS)

The Fort Jackson Military Entrance Processing Station is a jointly staffed, Department of Defense organization. The MEPS handles the initial testing, physical examinations, screening, occupational counseling and other administrative actions necessary for entry into all branches of the armed services based on service standards for aptitude, medical, and morals. The MEPS staff of 42 conducts more than 15,000 physical examinations and inspections, and processes nearly 10,000 people annually into all branches of military service. In addition,

the MEPS conduct more than 25,000 Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) tests each year throughout South Carolina and eastern Georgia.

Reserve

South Carolina has approximately 170 reserve-component units manned with about 15,000 Soldiers. Fort Jackson is the training site for many of these units. South Carolina Army National Guard units train here, and operate their Officer Candidate School, Noncommissioned Officer Academy and Primary Leadership Development School. For more information on scheduling a unit to train, call 751-7586.

108th Division

Fort Jackson is the home for two Army Reserve brigades and one drill sergeant battalion. The 3rd Brigade, 7th Brigade, and 1st Battalion, 321st Regiment, 1st Brigade are assigned to the 108th Division (Institutional Training) based in Charlotte, N.C. They are located in the Army Reserve Center on Boyden Arbor Road.

The 3rd Brigade oversees the individual training of combat support military occupational skills for the Army Reserve and Army National Guard enlisted Soldiers in the southeastern United States.

The 7th Brigade provides training support to the 108th Division as well as active duty units at Fort Jackson. Soldiers spend their battle assemblies conducting Army Reserve drill sergeant training and certification. They also operate and support various training ranges on Fort Jackson.

1st Battalion, 321st Regiment

The 1st Battalion, 321st Regiment, 1st Brigade is one of 10 similar units in the 108th Division made of Army Reserve drill sergeants who support Fort Jackson in their mission to train initial entry Soldiers during basic training. When called to active duty, they would enhance Fort Jackson's ability to train additional Soldiers in their early weeks in the Army.



These three units combined with the other units of the 108th Division (Institutional Training) provide initial entry training, school training in areas of combat support, health services and professional development, and instructor support to the Army National Guard and leadership school brigades. Remember, before warfighter, there is trainer.

157th Infantry Brigade

The 157th Infantry Brigade was activated Dec. 4, 2006 at Fort Jackson. The 157th Infantry Brigade has 600 active duty and Reserve Soldiers assigned to its five battalions spread over South Carolina and Georgia. 2-307th FA, 1-345th EN and 2-345th CS/CSS are located on Fort Jackson. 1-349th LSB and 2-347th CS/CSS are stationed at Fort Gordon, Ga.

The 157th Infantry Brigade's primary mission is to provide training assistance and evaluation to Reserve and National Guard units in South Carolina and the Southeastern United States. These priority Reserve and National Guard units

will be the first Reserve Components to deploy in the event of war. Additionally, in the event of disasters such as hurricanes, the 157th Infantry Brigade provides the Defense Coordinating Officer and the Defense Coordinating Element. Together, they exercise command and control of federal military forces working in conjunction with FEMA to assist state and local governments.

USAR Readiness Command

The USAR Readiness Command, located in Building 9810 on Lee Road, is a major subordinate command of the U.S. Army Reserve Command, located at Fort McPherson, Ga. The USARRC has two primary missions; to provided command and control (C2) to 20 units and 1,600 Soldiers located throughout the Continental United States. The units consist of Army Reserve Elements to Combatant Commands (Joint Forces Command—JFCOM, Transportation Command—TRANSCOM), to Department of Defense/Department of the Army Agencies (UCOM, Iceland defense Force,

LOGCAP DISA, Corp of Engineers, DLA) and two highly specialized units (Army Reserve Information Operations Command and Small Arms Readiness Group). The USARRC also conducts the Command Logistics Review Program of USARC major subordinate commands. For more information, contact 751-7653.

81st Regional Readiness Sustainment Command

One of four new Regional Readiness Sustainment Commands created as part of a 2005 Army Reserve transformation plan, the 81st RRSC entered a two-year carrier status in mid-September 2006. Construction of the new RRSC building on Fort Jackson is scheduled to start in early 2007 with a building occupancy date scheduled for March 2008. Personnel are temporarily being located in Building 9810 Lee Road. The 81st RRSC encompasses eight southeastern states: Alabama, Mississippi, South Carolina, North Carolina, Florida, Tennessee, Georgia, Louisiana and Kentucky. It will essentially replace the 81st Regional Readiness Command, which will disestablish in Birmingham, Ala., no later than September 2008.

Navy Reserve Center

The Navy Reserve Center Columbia at 2620 Lee Road provides leadership, support, and coordination for 10 assigned Navy Reserve units. To accomplish Navy goals the center staff, consisting of 12 Sailors, manages more than 250 mobilization-ready Sailors.

Marine Corps Detachment

The Marine Corps maintains a detachment on Magruder Avenue in Building 2300 with the following mission: to continue to develop and groom Marines in the accession pipeline to meet the challenges of present and future operational environments in support of operational forces and supporting establishments, through mentorship and formal Military Occupational Skill (MOS) training.

South Carolina at Your Leisure

There is a lot to see and do in South Carolina when you have a few days or more available to spend off post. The following is just a sampling, but should whet your appetite for the kaleidoscope of recreational opportunities this part of America has to offer.

The Grand Strand

Charleston

Historic Charleston is just 113 miles southeast of the post and filled with magnificently restored antebellum homes that once housed plantation owners who summered there for the cool ocean breezes. The harbor's major attractions include storied Fort Sumter, where the first shots of the Civil War were fired. For the more modern history buff, the harbor also boasts Patriot's Point, which is comprised of the aircraft carrier U.S.S. Yorktown, WWII's "Fighting Lady," as well as a submarine, a destroyer, a Coast Guard cutter, a re-creation of a Vietnam naval support base and the Medal of Honor Museum. The Citadel, one of the oldest and most storied of the military academies, is located on the western edge of Charleston.

Just outside of Charleston is the lovely Magnolia Plantation and Gardens. This is the 300-year-old ancestral home of South Carolina's illustrious Drayton family and is credited with being America's oldest manmade attraction. The plantation has been open to the public for more than a century. In it, you will find 250 varieties of azaleas and 900 varieties of camellias. Other features include an 18th-century herb garden, a biblical garden, a horticultural maze and the Audubon Swamp Garden. It is located 10 miles northwest of Charleston on Route 61. HISTORY & MUSEUMS



A Tradition of Excellence

On June 2, 1917, a new Army Training Center was established to answer America's call for trained fighting men the early ominous days of WWI. This installation would become the largest and most active if it's kind in the world.

First known as the Sixth National Cantonment, and later as Camp Jackson, Fort Jackson has always served as the Army's pioneer in the training environment. Named the Army's Community of Excellence in 1988, Fort Jackson has continued to earn awards for excellence year after year.

The initial site of the cantonment area consisted of almost 1,200 acres. The citizens of Columbia donated the land to the federal government, thereby initiating the long tradition of respect, cooperation and friendship between the city and the installation. In fact, Fort Jackson was incorporated into the city in October 1968.

Named in honor of Maj. Gen. Andrew Jackson, a native son of the Palmetto State and the seventh president of the United Sates, Camp Jackson was designated as one of 16 national cantonments constructed to support the war effort.

Years of Growth

The pressure of World War I brought swift changes. Within 11 days of the signing of a contract to construct the camp, the 110-man camp guard arrived. By the end of the first month, the labor force had grown to more than 1,200 and the first two barracks were completed.

Two months later, the force had grown to almost 10,000 men. Virtually overnight, Camp Jackson had grown from a sandy soil, pine and scrub oak forest to a thriving Army training center, complete with a trolley line and hundreds of buildings.

Three months after construction began, some 8,000 draftees arrived for training. The first military unit to be organized here was the 81st "Wildcat" Division, under the camp's first official commander, Maj. Gen. Charles H. Barth. Members of the original guard, who had been the first to occupy the camp, were moved to Camp Sevier in Greenville, S.C., and incorporated into the 30th "Old Hickory" Division, named in honor of Jackson.

More than 45,000 troops from these famed divisions went to France as part of the American Expeditionary Forces, including Freddie Stowers, the only African American recipient of the Medal of Honor from that war. He was a member of the 1st Provisional Infantry Regiment that trained at Fort Jackson.

The World War Years

In less than eight months, construction of the vast camp was complete. But almost as suddenly as it began, the clamor subsided. With the signing of the Armistice in 1918, the famed 30th Division was inactivated. The 5th Infantry Division trained here until it was inactivated in 1921. Control of the camp reverted to the Cantonment Lands Commission, and from 1925 to 1939, the sleepy silence was broken only by the occasional reports of weapons fired by state National Guardsmen.

In 1939, the demands of war brought the area again under federal control, and Fort Jackson was organized as an infantry training center. Four firing ranges were

constructed, and more than 100 miles of roads were hard surfaced and named for legendary Revolutionary War figures and heroes of the Civil War.

During World War II, the "Old Hickory" Division was one of the first units to reappear on the scene, just as it had in 1917. More than 500,000 men and women received some phase of their training here. Other famed units to train here during this period were the 4th, 6th, 8th, 26th, 77th, 87th, 100th and 106th. Other units at Fort Jackson trained thousands of troops during the Korean and Vietnam conflicts.

In May 1946, Fort Jackson became a replacement-training center. The 5th Infantry Division was reactivated here in 1947 as a training division. It was replaced in August by a reactivated 8th Infantry division following the outbreak of the Korean War. In January 1951 the 31st Infantry Division joined them.

By May 1954, the 31st and 8th Divisions had been transferred and were replaced by the famed 101st Airborne

Division, defenders of Bastogne during the Battle of the Bulge. On March 16, 1956, Fort Jackson was formally designated the United States Army Training Center, Infantry, as 10,000 troops paraded on Hilton Field and colors were changed in the ceremony. The 101st was transferred to Fort Campbell, Ky.

Throughout the 60s and 70s, Fort Jackson continued its mission of conducting basic training. In June 1973, Fort Jackson was designated as the United States Army Training Center, where young recruits were taught to think, look and act as Soldiers always.

Thousands of Soldiers were trained here as the Army experienced a "training revolution." Part of those changes included train fire, a system of rifle training that was tested and instituted at Fort Jackson. Another addition to the training environment included Victory Tower in 1976. This structure is used to reinforce the skills and confidence of the individual Soldier.

In 1987, more change took place, as 10 basic training battalions became part of regiments. The purpose of the United States Army Regimental System is to provide the opportunity for affiliation, develop loyalty and commitment, and improve esprit de corps.

90 Years of Excellence

Fort Jackson had grown over the years, but most of the buildings were temporary. Finally in 1964, construction began on permanent steel and concrete buildings to replace wooden barracks that had housed the fort's troops since the early 1940s. In recognition of the fort's 50th anniversary in 1967, the citizens of Columbia gave Fort Jackson the statue of Andrew Jackson that stands at Gate 1.

With the establishment of the modern volunteer Army in 1970 and the need to promote the attractiveness of service life, construction peaked in an effort to modernize facilities and improve services.





Through the years, changes have been made to enhance training. Victory Tower, an apparatus designed to complement basic combat training, is used to reinforce the skills and confidence of the individual Soldier. Field training exercises were incorporated into advance individual training so Soldiers would have an opportunity to practice MOS and common skills in a field environment.

By 1988, initial entry training strategy was implemented. The standard unit of training was the platoon. Training focused on hands-on skill development rather than platform instruction.

Fort Jackson continues to win awards as it moves toward our vision of the future. The goal is to make Fort Jackson the best living, working and training environment it can be. "Victory Starts Here," as it has since 1917.

Post Museums

Fort Jackson Museum

The Fort Jackson Museum, located at 4442 Jackson Blvd. across from Post Headquarters, was established in 1972 with an initial collection of only 20 artifacts. Since opening to the public in July 1974, the collection has grown to over 4,500 pieces of historical objects.

The museum uses an assortment of military weapons, uniforms and other equipment to illustrate how the American Soldiers have been trained to perform their duties in peacetime and war. These displays are supplemented by exhibitions that deal with special areas of interest,

such as women in the Army and the major units that have trained at Fort Jackson since World War I. Several typical military vehicles from World War II to the present are displayed outside the museum building, which is adjacent to a small picnic area. Additional vehicles and artillery pieces are located throughout the installation.

Museum hours are from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday, closed weekends and federal holidays. Extended Family Day hours are available. For information, call 751-7419.

Finance Corps Museum

The Finance Corps Museum transferred from the Army Finance Center, Fort Benjamin Harrison, Indiana to Fort Jackson in 1995 with the U.S. Army Finance School. It is the historical repository for artifacts documenting the history of the Finance Corps from its birth in 1775 to present. The Museum preserves branch-related historical memorabilia and provides interpretive displays representative of the history of the Finance Corps.

The Museum supports the training and professional development needs for Soldiers affiliated with the Finance Corps to encourage a better understanding of their branch values and contributions to the history of the U.S. Army.

The Museum is dedicated to furthering the educational needs and interests of the Fort Jackson community and the public. It is collocated with the U.S. Army Adjutant General's Corps Museum. The exhibit gallery is open to the public

Tuesday through Friday, from noon to 4 p.m., except federal holidays. The Museum facility is located on the corner of Strom Thurmond Boulevard and Magruder Avenue in Building 4392. Admission to the Museum is free and it is handicap accessible. Group tours are available by appointment. For more information, call 751-3771.


Adjutant General Museum

For more than 230 years, the mission of the Adjutant General's Corps has remained constant—to assist the commander in war and peace, and to provide superior personnel support to the Soldiers, civilians and the families which make up our Army. Traditionally, the Corps has been responsible for developing Army personnel and administrative policies and programs. Today, they continue to build and sustain combat readiness through dynamic human resources and administrative programs. The Adjutant General's Corps promotes the Soldier's well being by maintaining personnel and management support services, personnel strength management, casualty and memorial affairs, and the band and postal operations for America's Army.

The Adjutant General's Corps Museum is dedicated to the history of the Army's Adjutant General's Corps from 1775 to present. Historical documents, photos, uniforms and equipment depict the diverse history of the Corps. Today's AG Corps serves as human resource manager for the Army. It functions as the supervisor and coordinator of a unit's personnel and administration systems. Additionally, the AG Corps is the proponent for the Army bands, postal operations, and Morale, Welfare and Recreation activities.

The museum is open to the general public on Tuesday through Friday, from noon to 4 p.m. The museum facility is located on the corner of Strom Thurmond Boulevard and Magruder Avenue in Building 4392. Admission to the museum is free and it is handicap accessible. Group tours are available by appointment. For more information call 751-1747.



WARNING—Non-secure communication and information exchange is extremely vulnerable to hostile exploitation through monitoring. Do not attempt to "talk around" a classified or sensitive subject. Accumulated bits of seemingly "unimportant" information collected through continued monitoring when analyzed can provide hostile intelligence services with vital National Defense information. (Army Regulations 330-5 and 530-2).

Unofficial use of DSN, FTS 2001 and any other Department of Defense (DoD) funded telephone system is prohibited. Personnel found fraudulently using DoD telephone systems are subject to be disciplined to the maximum extent possible. Individuals found placing unofficial toll calls will pay for incurred charges (Army regulation 25-1).

Third party monitoring of a telephone conversation is prohibited unless all parties give consent. This also applies to use of hands-free speaker telephones when more than one person is present at the hands-free location.

It is a misdemeanor for anyone to use the telephone as a means of conveying obscene or indecent language or to make anonymous or repeated calls to annoy, abuse, embarrass or harass.

Do not process, store or transmit classified information on non-secure telecommunications systems. Official DoD telecommunications systems, including telephones, facsimile machines, computer networks and modems, are subject to monitoring for telecommunications systems constitutes consent to telecommunications security monitoring.

TELEPHONE SERVICE INFORMATION

ON POST DIALING: 4-XXXX

Fort Jackson Telephone Network uses FTS2000 for long distance service and Defense Switch Network (DSN) for Official Communications.

From an official Fort Jackson Government telephone, dial the number "4" and the last four digits of the telephone number. For example: "4-XXXX". Dial the number "9" to obtain an outside line for local and long distance calls. To place a telephone call via DSN, dial "88" then the DSN prefix for the particular installation and the number. Direct dial, long distance calls via commercial carriers cannot be made from the Fort Jackson exchange. OCONUS calls require a control number issued by the Staff Duty Officer and provided to the Telephone Operator who actually places the call.

TELEPHONE TROUBLES—To report official telephone service problems, broken phones, bad ringers, and cut or down lines, call 15. To report problems with commercial service, dial 780-2355 as indicated in the front of the Southern Bell Phone Book.

NEW/CHANGED SERVICE—To request new service or changes to existing service (moves, features, etc.), submit a Department of the Army Form 3938, "Local Service Request," to your unit Information Management Systems Control Officer (IMSCO). He or she will verify, approve and forward them to DOIM. DOIM will not accept or process telephone work orders which have not been signed by the IMSCO.

CHANGES TO TELEPHONE DIRECTORY—Any changes in organization names, activations and deactivations, relocations, or use of certain phone numbers or personnel position titles should be submitted on a Department of the Army Form 3938, "Local Service Request" through the unit IMSCO to DOW so the directory listings can be updated. Activities that relocate to new facilities, or deactivate, or require changes in current service, should submit DA Form 3938 to have official service changed or disconnected (each action should be noted on a separate W.O.)

SPECIAL TELEPHONE EQUIPMENT—IAW DA Pamphlet 251-1, Installation Information Services, 27 August 1991, paragraph 3-4.9.1, any special communications equipment to include, but not necessarily limited to telephone instruments, FAX machines, answering machines, computer modems, speaking devices and broadcast devices must be approved in writing by the DOIM prior to connection to an official telephone network. Requests for special equipment should be made to the DOIM Network/information Center using the Capabilities and Requirements (CAPR) Form.

CLASS OF SERVICE

These are the basic classes of service: *CLASS O* – accesses on post numbers only.

CLASS 1 – accesses numbers on post and within the local Columbia area.

CLASS 3 – accesses on post numbers and 1-800 only.
CLASS 5 – accesses numbers on post, Columbia area, DSN and FTS 2001.

CLASS 9 – accesses on post and DSN numbers
 CLASS 14 – all access, including 24-hour long distance, requires justification and DOIM approval.
 CLASS 15 – on post, local Columbia area and DSN.

CLASS 18 – restricted TISI dial-up access.

LIMITATION OF AFTER-DUTY ACCESS TO LONG DISTANCE SERVICE AND TELEPHONE CONTROL NUMBERS—Access to long distance or FTS 2001 service is restricted between 1730 and 0730 hours Monday through Friday and all day Saturday, Sunday and on holidays. Emergency personnel and certain duty officers still have long distance access. Other personnel who need to place an official long distance call during these hours of restricted access are required to have a telephone control number before the call will be placed. To obtain a telephone control number, contact your respective Unit's designated agent. The Post Staff Duty Officer no longer issues telephone control numbers; each Unit, Directorate and Activity issues them. The Post Operator will place the call when a valid telephone control number is provided.

IDENTIFYING DIAL-UP DATA LINES—All data line jacks should have the telephone number written on the jack. If it has been inadvertently erased or painted over the phone number can be obtained by plugging a pushbutton phone into the jack and dialing 15; the Operator will tell you the phone number. This will facilitate reporting trouble on the line.

TELEPHONE FEATURES

Available telephone features are listed below. To activate these features you need only use the switchhook flash or a combination of the switchhook flash, the * key and the access code The first three features are available on all single-line, touchtone telephones. Other features must be requested on a Department of the Army Form 3938.

FLEXIBLE STATION-CONTROLLED

BOMB THREAT PROCEDURES

DIAL 9-1-1 FOR ALL EMERGENCIES

If you receive a bomb threat DO NOT hang up the telephone. Use another telephone to notify the Military Police. If another telephone is not available, then you must use the same instrument. Either way, call the Military Police at extension 3113/3114/911. If possible danger to life or property is involved, alert everyone and vacate the area. Use the following chart as a guide when receiving or reporting a bomb threat.

REPORT CALL IMMEDIATELY TO MILITARY POLICE

TORNADO PROCEDURES

Tornadoes occur frequently in South Carolina with March, April and May being the peak months. There may be little to no advance warning and tornadoes are extremely unpredictable. Measures to protect yourself and your family must be taken immediately.

TORNADO WATCHES are issued by the National Weather Service (NWS) and mean that conditions are favorable for the formation of tornadoes. Monitor radio and television and listen for the Fort Jackson Tornado Warning Siren. Prepare to take shelter immediately.

TORNADO WARNINGS are also issued by the NWS and mean that tornado formation is imminent or a tornado has actually been sighted. If you see a NWS Tornado Warning on television, for the Fort Jackson area, or hear the Fort Jackson tornado-warning siren, TAKE SHELTER IMMEDIATELY.

TORNADO SIREN The mass notification system (tornado warning siren) is currently located on fifteen towers across the cantonment area. When a tornado warning pertinent to the Fort Jackson area is received from the National Weather Service (NWS) at either the Emergency Services Center (ESC) or the Installation Operation Center (IOC), either one or both of those locations can activate the tornado warning.

The tornado warning consists of a 15-second pulsed steady tone followed by the announcement Your attention please. A tornado warning is in effect for the Fort Jackson area. Fort Jackson is in imminent danger of severe weather. Take shelter immediately," with one repetition.

When the danger has passed, the ESC or the IOC will issue the "all clear" which is a 15-second pulsed steady tone followed by, "Your attention please. All clear, the danger has passed and Fort Jackson is no longer in an emergency status. You may resume normal activities," with one repetition.

In addition to the "canned" messages that the system is capable of delivering, there is a public address system capability at both the ESC and IOC. This enables the operator to speak over any of the towers independently, in small groups, or across the entire system in order to issue special warnings and instructions.

The Mass Notification System is tested every Wednesday at 1130. If bad weather actually threatens at that time, the test will be cancelled.

TORNADO SAFETY

While there is no place that is 100 percent safe during a tornado, some are safer than others.

TAKE SHELTER:

- In an interior closet.
- · Under interior stairs.
- In a bathroom, (interior if possible.)
- Next to a bed with the mattress over you.

STAY AWAY FROM:

- Windows. Flying glass is the greatest danger. Heavy objects such as appliances and bookshelves
- Corridors facing the wind.

IF AWAY FROM HOME:

- · If in a motor vehicle, get out and seek shelter. If no shelter is available, seek a depression or ditch. DO NOT attempt to take shelter under an overpass
- Get away from windows.
- Get low, protect your head.
- Avoid trees, poles and power lines

THUNDERSTORM WATCHES are issued when the National Weather Service determines that conditions are right for the formation of a thunderstorm. You should monitor a radio or television to see if severe thunderstorms are predicted to pass through the area. Keep listening to the radio or television for updates.

THUNDERSTORM WARNINGS are issued when a thunderstorm actually exists and is predicted to hit this area. Remain indoors. If in the field, ground weapons and move to a lightning shelter area.

MINIMIZE LONG DISTANCE TELEPHONE TRAFFIC IN **AN EMERGENCY**

When an actual or simulated emergency arises, or is anticipated, it is necessary to reduce the volume of record and long distance telephone traffic ordinarily transmitted over U.S. Military Networks. This action is required to facilitate prompt transmission of essential traffic, which must be transmitted electronically to avoid a serious impact on mission accomplishment or personnel safety.

Notification will be transmitted by the Joint Chiefs of Staff (JCS) or the Command concerned, as appropriate, MINIMIZE will be automatically imposed upon declaration of a defense emergency. The Joint Chiefs of Staff or Command concerned will convert to MINIMIZE when it is no longer required.

During periods when MINIMIZE is imposed over voice communication, authority to originate or certify long-distance telephone calls will be limited to the Commander or his designated representative within the command or activity, normally the Information Management Systems Control Officer (IMSCO).

Upon notification the MINIMIZE is imposed, switchboard operators will advise the person for whom calls are pending of the MINIMIZE condition. All calls placed subsequently must be authorized according to the Joint Uniform Precedence System.

A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE DEFENSE SWITCHED NETWORK

The DSN is a primary information transfer network for the Defense Information Systems Network (DISN). The DSN provides the worldwide non-secure voice, secure voice, data, facsimile, and video teleconferencing services for DoD Command and Control (C2) elements, their supporting activities engaged in logistics, personnel, engineering, and intelligence, as well as other Federal agencies.

In 1982, the DSN was designated by the Office of the Secretary of Defense and the Joint Chiefs of Staff (JCS) as the provider of long-distance communications service for the DoD. The DSN is designated as a primary system of communication during peacetime and during periods of crisis, pre-attack, non-nuclear, and post-attack phases of war. The network assures non-blocking service for users with flash and flash override precedence capabilities. Key users include the National Command Authorities, Commanders in Chief (CINCs) of the Unified Commands, and strategic and tactical subordinate commanders.

The DSN consists of four subsystems: Switching, Transmission, Timing and Synchronization, and Network Administration and Management. The DSN Switching Subsystem consists of multi-function, stand alone tandem, end office, and remote switching units. Using the transmission, timing, and control elements of the DISN, the switching units interconnect all military locations worldwide and provide end-to-end long-distance common user and dedicated voice, secure voice, data, and video services worldwide.

In addition to non-secure voice, data, and video services, the DSN provides transmission, switching, and support services for Secure Telephone Units, Third Generation (STU- IIIs), the Secure Terminal Equipment (STE), the Defense RED Switch Network (DRSN), dial-up alternative routing for the Unclassified but Sensitive Internet Protocol (IP) Router Network (NIPRNet), and the Secret IP Router Network (SIPRNet). The DSN also provides access to the Government Emergency Telephone System (GETS).

FOREWORD

The *Defense Switched Network Telephone Directory* is divided into six geographical listings: Alaska, Canada, the Continental United States (CONUS), Europe, the Pacific, and Central Command.

The Defense Switched Network Telephone Directory cannot list all subscriber numbers. It does provide a facility or organizational central contact telephone number, which is generally an operator assistance number. If you do not have the current number for the party to whom you wish to speak, use the central contact number to obtain your party's number or to have your call forwarded.

Listings in the directory are in two formats. Both proper name and facility type are used for ease of location of posts, bases, camps, and stations. For example, Camp (CP) Smith, is listed as Smith, Camp and CP Smith; the Naval Air Facility at Atsugi is listed as Atsugi Naval Air Facility and Naval Air Facility-Atsugi; and Lackland Air Force Base (AFB) is listed as Lackland AFB and AFB, Lackland. Units identified by numerical designations are listed in numerical order, not by unit type. For example, the 121ST Tactical Fighter Wing (TFW) is listed only as the 121ST TFW.

The *Defense Switched Network Telephone Directory* is in alphabetical order by area code (e.g. Alaska, Canada, CONUS). The seven-digit operator assistance telephone number is sorted numerically.

NATIONAL COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM VOICE PRECEDENCE SYSTEM

The National Communications System (NCS) Voice Precedence System, which was established by *NCS Memorandum* 1-70, 14 February 1970, is for use by all authorized users of DoD voice communications facilities. Since the effectiveness of the system depends on the cooperation of the people authorized to use it, users must: (1) be familiar with the purposes of each precedence category and the type of call that is assigned the precedence and (2) exercise care not to request or use a precedence higher than required.

The NCS Voice Precedence System does not make provisions for conducting test and exercise calls. Those activities or individuals authorized or required to conduct such test or exercise calls will use precedence consistent with the nature of the test or exercise. When the originator of the test or exercise calls will be identified immediately as a flash, immediate, or priority precedence test or exercise.

The following examples should aid users in determining what precedence to use when placing a call. These examples are according to the NCS Voice Precedence System, but are not to be used exclusively for determination of the precedence of a call. This should be at the discretion of the originator of the call.

- Flash Override. Flash override is considered a capability, not a level of precedence. Exercising this capability preempts calls of all other levels or precedence. The flash override capability is available to the following users:
 - The President of the United States of America.
 - The Secretary of Defense and the Chairman of the JCS.
 - Commanders of Unified Command.
- Flash. Flash calls preempt immediate, priority, and routine calls. Listed below are examples of flash calls:
 - Calls pertaining to C2 of military forces essential to defense and retaliation.
 - Critical intelligence essential to national survival.
 - Conduct of diplomatic negotiations critical to ceasing or limiting hostilities.
 - Dissemination of critical civil alert information essential to national survival.
 - Continuity of Federal Government functions essential to national survival.
 - Fulfillment of critical United States internal security functions essential to national survival.
 - Catastrophic events of national or international significance.
- Immediate. Immediate calls preempt priority and routine calls and are reserved for communications pertaining to situations that gravely affect the security of national and Allied forces. Listed below are some examples of immediate calls:
 - Reconstitution of forces in a post-attack period.
 - Intelligence essential to national security.
 - Conduct of diplomatic negotiations to reduce or limit the threat of war.
- Implementation of Federal Government actions essential to national survival.
- Situations that gravely affect the security of the United States.
- Civil defense actions concerning the direction of the population and their survival.
- Disaster or events serious enough to have an immediate and detrimental effect on the welfare of the population.
- Vital information having an immediate effect on aircraft, spacecraft, or missile operations.
- Distress assistance.
- Priority. Priority calls preempt routine calls and are reserved for communications requiring expeditious action by called parties furnishing essential information for conducting government operations.

 Routine. The routine precedence applies to official government communications that require rapid transmission by telephonic means but do not require preferential handling. A routine call does not preempt any other call.

WHAT CATEGORY OF NETWORK CUSTOMER ARE YOU?

There are three types of DSN users:

- Special Command and Control (C2) Users. A special class of user who has direct, unrestricted access to the DSN for essential communications and planning, and for directing and controlling the operations of assigned forces pursuant to assigned missions. This user requires capabilities that provide crisis, pre-attack, and theater non-nuclear war telecommunications service for intelligence, alert, and strategic readiness. This user also requires communications among the President, Secretary of Defense, JCS, Services Chiefs, and the CINCs. Specifically, these Special C2 users are identified through one or more Joint Staff, CINC, Service, or agency validation process. Also, they are all RED switch subscribers and the following identified subscribers of common user networks:
- Joint Staff-approved flash override, flash precedence origination capability.
- CINC- or service-approved flash precedence origination capability.
- CINC- service-validated, or agency-validated connectivity identified as part of C2 networks that support secondary (or lower) strategic connectivity missions.
- CINC-validated minimum essential circuits as approved in the Pacific Joint Multi-channel Trunking and Switching System and the European Theater Communications Architecture.
- C2 Users. Users having a requirement for C2 communications who do not meet the criteria for the class of Special C2 users. C2 users include any person (regardless of their position in the chain of command) who issues guidance or orders that direct, control, or coordinate any military forces, regardless of the nature of the military mission, whether said guidance or order is issued or effected during peace or wartime.
- Other Users. DoD, non-DoD, non-government and foreign government users having no missions or communications requirements to ever originate or receive C2 communications under the definitions for C2 or Special C2 Users. During a crisis or contingency, they may be denied access to the DSN or DRSN. These users are provided access to the DSN for the economic benefits to the DoD.

WHO IS LISTED IN THE DSN TELEPHONE DIRECTORY?

Any post, camp, base, or station served by the DSN that formally requests to be included in the directory is listed. Individual listings are restricted to command level, agency level, or organization level. To be included in the *Defense Switched Network Telephone*

Directory, or to correct or delete an existing directory listing, complete the form included in Appendix A: Request for Listing. Return the form to:

DSN TELEPHONE DIRECTORY DISTRIBUTION

It is neither cost-effective nor productive to publish and distribute a hardcopy version of the global Defense Switched Network Telephone Directory or to provide a listing of all commands, activities, and agencies that have the capability to access the network. However, the directory needs the widest possible distribution to be useful. The directory is made available as a downloadable file on the World Wide Web at http://dsnbbs.ncr.disa.mil/. If access to the Web is unavailable, consult your local operator or your servicing command element. Local reproduction is authorized and encouraged. Instructions for accessing the DSN Directory Web site are set forth in Appendix B: Instructions for Accessing the DSN Web site.

Publishers of local directories are strongly encouraged to include any part of this directory in their directories.

NETWORK RECORDING AND SIGNAL TONES

What do the various tones and recorded announcements tell you about the progress or disposition of your call?

- When you hear a dial tone, the network is ready for your call. Dial your number.
- When you hear a ringing tone, your called number is ringing. Wait for your party to answer. On routine calls, you should hear a normal ringing tone (10 rings per minute). On calls of higher precedence, you will hear a very fast ringing tone (30 rings per minute).
- When you hear a busy tone, several possibilities exist. The called number may be in use, local equipment at your location may be busy, network equipment may be busy, or an equipment failure may have occurred. After a brief wait, call again.
- When you hear a preempt tone, your call was cut
 off by a higher precedence call. Hang up; the call
 may be for you. If the preempted call requires
 completion, wait a short time and redial.
- A conference call is preceded by a warbling tone.
 When you hear this, stand by for instructions or for the other parties of the conference to be connected.

Below are some of the recorded announcements you might hear while using the DSN. If you hear one of these announcements and feel it may be an indication of trouble, report the possible trouble according to the procedures outlined in the "Telephone Trouble and Unsatisfactory Service Reporting" section of this

directory. Note the error message number and provide it to repair personnel. The error message number will also be helpful to your supporting telephone service provider during the troubleshooting of access problems.

- "Your call cannot be completed as dialed. Please consult your directory and call again or ask your operator for assistance. This is a recording (pause) error message number/switch number and country."
- "The precedence used is not authorized for your line. Please use an authorized precedence or ask your operator for assistance. This is a recording (pause) error message number/switch number and country."
- "Equal or higher precedence calls have prevented the completion of your call, or the number you have dialed is not equipped for preemption. This is a recording (pause) error message number/switch number and country."
- "A DSN service disruption has prevented the completion of your call. Please wait 30 minutes and try again. In case of an emergency, call your operator. This is a recording (pause) error message number/switch number and country."

CALLING PROCEDURES

VOICE TELEPHONE CALLS (31X)

Voice telephone calls can access a DSN line by either direct dialing or dialing the operator. Here is how each process works:

- If you do the dialing:
 - Listen for the dial tone.
 - Dial the DSN number access number if required.
 - Listen for the DSN dial tone.
 - Dial the desired DSN phone number, with precedence and area code if required.
- · If the operator dials for you:
 - Give your name and local base telephone extension number.
 - Give your precedence.
 - Provide the DSN number you are calling and any other information.
 - Wait on the line until the operator connects you to the called party.

DATA TELEPHONE CALLS (50X AND 51X)

Transmission of data on the DSN will be allowed by exception and will be severely limited by CINCs, Services, and Defense Agencies. The Defense Data Network (DDN) NIPRNet and SIPRNet are the primary networks for data transmissions.

Dial-up Data. Use of DSN-switched voice (dial-up) circuits to transmit digital data will be detrimental to voice users. Long circuit holding times will affect the network grade of service (GOS) and significantly degrade other users' ability to complete calls. Data processing equipment may use DSN voice circuits only when the DDN and other transmission media, either commercial or government-owned, do not exist or are required for emergencies or reasons of national security. Data equipment includes computer-controlled graphics

(other than facsimile), word processors, mainframe and microcomputers, laptops, and other personal communications system (PCS) and similar equipment.

- Data processing equipment using DSN voice circuits (dial-up) will be capable of automatically disconnecting from the access line or interswitch trunk when the transmission is complete or the circuit is preempted.
- Approval authority for outside CONUS (OCONUS) data transmissions through DSN dial-up circuits is the Combat Commander. CONUS authority is the Combat Commander, Chief of the Service, or the Director of the Defense Agency concerned. Each request will be coordinated with DISA to determine the network impact. DISA will be notified of each approval specifically to determine why the DDN cannot support the requirement. Blanket approvals for use will identify a connect limit, and an expiration or revalidation date.
- Dial-up Facsimile. The DSN may be used to transmit unsecured facsimile traffic without an STU-III only if the facsimile machine or computer transmits within 1 minute after the facsimile transmission ends or the circuit is preempted.
- Secure Transmission with an STU-III. Use of an STU-III in the secure mode for voice communications is not interpreted as data transmission. When the STU-III is used to transmit secure data or a facsimile, the following criteria will be met:
- The STU-III at each end will be monitored during the entire transmission to ensure the circuit is maintained and the STU-III is in the secure mode.
- The STU-III preempt feature will be enabled at all times.
- National guidance for the use of STU-III in secure data transmission, including access control, TEMPEST, and computer security, must be followed.

CONFERENCE CALLS

To schedule a conference call across the DSN, contact your local operator. Tell the operator that you wish to make a conference call and provide a list of numbers to be included in the conference.

Preset conferences may be established. Consult your supporting DISA Field Office for further information.

CALLS TO COMMERCIAL TOLL FREE NUMBERS

(809 Service - Making Toll Free Commercial Calls From The DSN)

As authorized by CJCSI 6215.01B, Policy for DoD Voice Networks, Paragraph 7.b(2)(c), DISA has implemented a new off-netting interface as a Managed Interface between the DSN and the Public Switched Telephone Network (PSTN). This interface allows for the use of any 1-800 type toll free numbers (specifically 800, 888, 866, and 877) on the PSTN and is accessed by —dialing the DSN telephone number: (809) 4-0FF-DSN

(809-463-3376). Access/usage is authorized for all DSN users as provided by the *CJCSI 6215.01B*.

This capability was designed to:

- Reduce O&M's manpower requirement for operator assistance.
- Reduce traffic on access trunks.
- Reduce resource overhead during manual call handling.
- · Improve Customer Service.
- Reduce requirement for commercial service to tactical sites.

The applicable DSN rates apply, from the user's location to CONUS, since the technical interfaces for the PSTN accesses are located in CONUS. Local commanders can limit/restrict access to this service by Class of Service tables and class-marking user lines to control costs and/or meet other mission requirements.

Authorized users of this interface are:

- Government contractors and vendors with 1-800 numbers.
- · Help Desk numbers for hardware/software.
- Non-toll PSTN numbers with a 1-800 number for Credit Card calling, where the toll charges are applied to the Credit Card (Credit Card calling can be made with either Government-provided calling cards (FTS), or personal cards).
- Reverse Billing to call recipient via "1-800 Call Collect" Services.

How to use the 809 service:

- 1. Dial (809) 4-OFF-DSN (809-463-3376).
- 2. You will receive a second dial tone.
- Dial your toll free number, including the "1" (e.g., (800) 123-4567).

CALL ASSISTANCE

Switchboard operators are available to assist DSN users. If you are having trouble completing a call, dial "(312) 231-1311" to reach the operator.

INTER-AREA CALLING

The DSN provides global telephone service for authorized users. Some users can call everywhere, while others are limited to one particular area or combination of areas. Where you can call depends on your mission and how your telephone line is classmarked. If your calling area is limited, you will not be able to dial outside your calling area. The local directory indicates the calling areas and codes available to you. The area code need not be dialed for calls within your area. Calls to an area outside the local call boundary require an area code plus the seven-digit DSN number. If you are transmitting data, alternate area codes are used.

NEW OR ADDITIONAL SERVICE

To obtain new DSN service or to change the type of service you now have, consult *DISA Circular 310-130-1, Submission of Telecommunications Service Requests*, or consult your local telecommunications support office.

SPECIAL SERVICES

"510" service is the DSN equivalent of commercial "800" toll free service. If you have a requirement for this type of service at your organization, contact DISA HQ, Code GS23.

USER-PROVIDED EQUIPMENT

The terminal equipment provided by the user for connection to a DSN Switching Center must meet the technical interface criteria outlined in *DISA Circular* 370-175-13.

REPORTING TELEPHONE TROUBLE

Ensure that the DSN number you have dialed is correct. If you dialed the number correctly and are still having trouble, report the problem as follows:

- Keep the line connected if you can. Overseas users should call their local telephone reporting desk or the local operator. CONUS users should call the DSN Customer Service desk at DSN 550-1611 or commercial at (800) 967-6194. Tell the attendant:
 - Your DSN number and location.
 - Called party DSN number and location.
 - What the problem was and when it occurred.
 - If you hear an announcement, listen to the entire recording. You will hear an error message and a switch number and country name. Provide this information to the trouble desk. The information will help technicians trace the source of the trouble.
 - Get the attendant's initials and then request a call back when the trouble is corrected.

REPORTING UNSATISFACTORY SERVICE

- If you are not satisfied with the results when you report a problem, contact the appropriate DISA organization for your area. If the problem is technical rather than procedural, specific details may be required. If you need assistance in filling out the report, contact your local telecommunications officer or the officer-in-charge (OIC) of the station switchboard. The report must contain the following information:
 - Your station name, unit name, DSN telephone number, and whether the trouble concerns a telephone or a switchboard.
 - The time and date you noticed the problem, the DSN trouble desk to which it was reported, and whether the problem was solved.
 - What kind of problem you had and the impact it had on your mission.
- If you are unhappy with the agency that was supposed to fix the problem, tell us exactly what unit it is, when you called them, when they responded, and when and if the problem was repaired. Let us know why you think their service was unsatisfactory. If this is a repeated problem, inform us how many times and whether your comments apply to each occurrence.

Action: Send the report to DISA HQ, Code GS23, or the supporting DISA Field Office for your organization. A list of field offices is provided in Appendix E, "List of DISA Field Offices".

Information: The Operations and Maintenance (O&M) Agency in your area responsible for providing service.






