



NEPA Review Process

- National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA)
 - NEPA Public Scoping process encourages public participation
 - Environmental Assessments (EAs) will examine the potential impacts of proposed projects
- Public Scoping
 - Federal, state, and local agencies, organizations, and the public are invited to provide input to the EAs
 - Identify issues believed to be pertinent to the analysis of the potential environmental impacts of the proposed projects
 - DOE will send out Scoping Letters on the proposed project(s) and invite your participation

Renewable Fuels Heating Facility

- Reduce the cost of heating NREL buildings
- Wood-fired furnace to heat a portion of South Table Mountain facilities
 - Displaces natural gas use with renewable resource (local forest thinnings & wood chips)


- Consolidate Administration and Research
 Organizations on DOE's South Table Mountain Site
- Design and Construct a ~30K to ~70K GSF Support Building (\$9.9M+)
 - National Showcase for Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy

Scoping Letter Anticipated - December 2006 Design/Construction - Spring 2007

Integrated Biorefinery Facility

- Enhance NREL's biomass to ethanol research capability
- Expand the Current Alternative Fuels User Facility (\$19.5M)
 - 21,000 sf (7,000 sf footprint) addition





- Install infrastructure to support current and future STM site development
- Utilities, roads, and other improvements (\$2.5M)
