

Number of farms

247 farms in 2002, 290 farms in 1997, down 15 percent.

Land in farms

43,061 acres in 2002, 48,089 acres in 1997, down 10 percent.

Average size of farm

174 acres in 2002, 166 acres in 1997, up 5 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$2,486,000 in 2002, \$6,676,000 in 1997, down 63 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$1,573,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$913,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$10,065 in 2002, \$23,019 in 1997, down 56 percent.


Government Payments
