


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**



## Rockcastle, Kentucky

#### **Number of farms**

803 farms in 2002, 853 farms in 1997, down 6 percent.

#### Land in farms

94,186 acres in 2002, 98,449 acres in 1997, down 4 percent.

#### Average size of farm

117 acres in 2002, 115 acres in 1997, up 2 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$9,219,000 in 2002, \$10,728,000 in 1997, down 14 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$3,799,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$5,419,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$11,480 in 2002, \$12,577 in 1997, down 9 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
