

137,356 acres in 2002, 148,264 acres in 1997, down 7 percent.

Average size of farm

162 acres in 2002, 159 acres in 1997, up 2 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$48,536,000 in 2002, \$65,530,000 in 1997, down 26 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$13,152,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$35,384,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$57,236 in 2002, \$70,462 in 1997, down 19 percent.


Government Payments
