

Shelby, Kentucky

Number of farms

1,557 farms in 2002, 1,533 farms in 1997, up 2 percent.

Land in farms

201,667 acres in 2002, 204,292 acres in 1997, down 1 percent.

Average size of farm

130 acres in 2002, 133 acres in 1997, down 2 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$45,637,000 in 2002, \$56,575,000 in 1997, down 19 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$26,169,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$19,467,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$29,311 in 2002, \$36,905 in 1997, down 21 percent.


Government Payments
