

Simpson, Kentucky

Number of farms

550 farms in 2002, 659 farms in 1997, down 17 percent.

Land in farms

127,911 acres in 2002, 122,852 acres in 1997, up 4 percent.

Average size of farm

233 acres in 2002, 186 acres in 1997, up 25 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$41,628,000 in 2002, \$33,693,000 in 1997, up 24 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$21,340,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$20,289,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$75,688 in 2002, \$51,127 in 1997, up 48 percent.


Government Payments
