


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**



## Taylor, Kentucky

#### **Number of farms**

957 farms in 2002, 1,068 farms in 1997, down 10 percent.

#### Land in farms

112,317 acres in 2002, 114,581 acres in 1997, down 2 percent.

#### Average size of farm

117 acres in 2002, 107 acres in 1997, up 9 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$20,070,000 in 2002, \$24,916,000 in 1997, down 19 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$7,999,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$12,071,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$20,972 in 2002, \$23,329 in 1997, down 10 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
