

Market Value of Production

\$62,472,000 in 2002, \$71,601,000 in 1997, down 13 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$32,272,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$30,200,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$92,414 in 2002, \$95,596 in 1997, down 3 percent.


