

# Trigg, Kentucky

#### **Number of farms**

425 farms in 2002, 459 farms in 1997, down 7 percent.

#### Land in farms

122,943 acres in 2002, 119,843 acres in 1997, up 3 percent.

## Average size of farm

289 acres in 2002, 261 acres in 1997, up 11 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$19,995,000 in 2002, \$26,613,000 in 1997, down 25 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$14,311,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$5,684,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$47,048 in 2002, \$57,981 in 1997, down 19 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
