

Land in farms

208,908 acres in 2002, 224,586 acres in 1997, down 7 percent.

Average size of farm

637 acres in 2002, 552 acres in 1997, up 15 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$43,347,000 in 2002, \$61,698,000 in 1997, down 30 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$38,027,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$5,320,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$132,156 in 2002, \$151,592 in 1997, down 13 percent.


Government Payments
