


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**



# Warren, Kentucky

#### **Number of farms**

1,881 farms in 2002, 2,048 farms in 1997, down 8 percent.

#### Land in farms

255,154 acres in 2002, 269,242 acres in 1997, down 5 percent.

# Average size of farm

136 acres in 2002, 131 acres in 1997, up 4 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$61,479,000 in 2002, \$65,948,000 in 1997, down 7 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$23,803,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$37,676,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$32,684 in 2002, \$32,201 in 1997, up 1 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
