


2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

Number of farms

1,119 farms in 2002, 1,142 farms in 1997, down 2 percent.

Land in farms

149,739 acres in 2002, 162,741 acres in 1997, down 8 percent.

Average size of farm

134 acres in 2002, 143 acres in 1997, down 6 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$27,060,000 in 2002, \$32,883,000 in 1997, down 18 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$12,144,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$14,915,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$24,182 in 2002, \$28,794 in 1997, down 16 percent.


Government Payments
