

# Woodford, Kentucky

#### **Number of farms**

708 farms in 2002, 743 farms in 1997, down 5 percent.

#### Land in farms

123,070 acres in 2002, 124,385 acres in 1997, down 1 percent.

### Average size of farm

174 acres in 2002, 167 acres in 1997, up 4 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$171,917,000 in 2002, \$116,464,000 in 1997, up 48 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$9,661,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$162,256,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$242,821 in 2002, \$156,748 in 1997, up 55 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
