

Breckinridge, Kentucky

276,456 acres in 2002, 281,261 acres in 1997, down 2 percent.

Average size of farm

192 acres in 2002, 187 acres in 1997, up 3 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$28,714,000 in 2002, \$32,712,000 in 1997, down 12 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$12,623,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$16,091,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$19,899 in 2002, \$21,794 in 1997, down 9 percent.


Government Payments
