

147,207 acres in 2002, 157,980 acres in 1997, down 7 percent.

Average size of farm

219 acres in 2002, 226 acres in 1997, down 3 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$17,945,000 in 2002, \$23,305,000 in 1997, down 23 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$12,219,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$5,727,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$26,665 in 2002, \$33,293 in 1997, down 20 percent.


Government Payments
