


2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile

Number of farms

107,446 acres in 2002, 98,060 acres in 1997, up 10 percent.

Average size of farm

283 acres in 2002, 262 acres in 1997, up 8 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$31,473,000 in 2002, \$26,308,000 in 1997, up 20 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$15,452,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$16,021,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$82,823 in 2002, \$70,342 in 1997, up 18 percent.


