Carroll, Kentucky

Number of farms 339 farms in 2002, 348 farms in 1997, down 3 percent.

Land in farms 61,122 acres in 2002, 61,166 acres in 1997, down slightly.

Average size of farm 180 acres in 2002, 176 acres in 1997, up 2 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$8,007,000 in 2002, \$8,863,000 in 1997, down 10 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$6,148,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$1,859,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$23,620 in 2002, \$25,469 in 1997, down 7 percent.


