

Carter, Kentucky

Number of farms

925 farms in 2002, 976 farms in 1997, down 5 percent.

Land in farms

120,382 acres in 2002, 116,162 acres in 1997, up 4 percent.

Average size of farm

130 acres in 2002, 119 acres in 1997, up 9 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$7,033,000 in 2002, \$9,836,000 in 1997, down 28 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$3,553,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$3,480,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$7,603 in 2002, \$10,078 in 1997, down 25 percent.


Government Payments
