

Market Value of Production

\$3,713,000 in 2002, \$5,310,000 in 1997, down 30 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$3,001,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$712,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$9,619 in 2002, \$12,320 in 1997, down 22 percent.


Government Payments
