


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**



# **Daviess, Kentucky**

#### **Number of farms**

1,062 farms in 2002, 1,161 farms in 1997, down 9 percent.

#### Land in farms

254,332 acres in 2002, 260,806 acres in 1997, down 2 percent.

#### Average size of farm

239 acres in 2002, 225 acres in 1997, up 6 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$62,732,000 in 2002, \$73,251,000 in 1997, down 14 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$46,022,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$16,711,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$59,070 in 2002, \$63,093 in 1997, down 6 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
