


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**



# **Fayette, Kentucky**

#### **Number of farms**

738 farms in 2002, 826 farms in 1997, down 11 percent.

#### Land in farms

119,098 acres in 2002, 138,606 acres in 1997, down 14 percent.

#### Average size of farm

161 acres in 2002, 168 acres in 1997, down 4 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$178,892,000 in 2002, \$141,357,000 in 1997, up 27 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$14,439,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$164,453,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$242,401 in 2002, \$171,135 in 1997, up 42 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
