

Number of farms

689 farms in 2002, 736 farms in 1997, down 6 percent.

Land in farms

82,056 acres in 2002, 85,050 acres in 1997, down 4 percent.

Average size of farm

119 acres in 2002, 116 acres in 1997, up 3 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$12,143,000 in 2002, \$15,760,000 in 1997, down 23 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$7,360,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$4,783,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$17,625 in 2002, \$21,413 in 1997, down 18 percent.


Government Payments
