

Market Value of Production

\$30,174,000 in 2002, \$25,243,000 in 1997, up 20 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$19,826,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$10,348,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$156,341 in 2002, \$130,794 in 1997, up 20 percent.


Government Payments
