

240,440 acres in 2002, 252,739 acres in 1997, down 5 percent.

119 acres in 2002, 116 acres in 1997, up 3 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$62,794,000 in 2002, \$60,342,000 in 1997, up 4 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$16,024,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$46,770,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$31,071 in 2002, \$27,629 in 1997, up 12 percent.


Government Payments
