


2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile



Grayson, Kentucky

Number of farms

1,650 farms in 2002, 1,568 farms in 1997, up 5 percent.

Land in farms

233,136 acres in 2002, 221,081 acres in 1997, up 5 percent.

Average size of farm

141 acres in 2002, 141 acres in 1997, unchanged.

Market Value of Production

\$31,642,000 in 2002, \$34,860,000 in 1997, down 9 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$7,548,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$24,094,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$19,177 in 2002, \$22,232 in 1997, down 14 percent.


Government Payments
