

# Hancock, Kentucky

#### **Number of farms**

418 farms in 2002, 494 farms in 1997, down 15 percent.

#### Land in farms

68,868 acres in 2002, 68,138 acres in 1997, up 1 percent.

### Average size of farm

165 acres in 2002, 138 acres in 1997, up 20 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$9,480,000 in 2002, \$12,286,000 in 1997, down 23 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$5,152,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$4,329,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$22,681 in 2002, \$24,870 in 1997, down 9 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
