


2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile



Hardin, Kentucky

Number of farms

1,732 farms in 2002, 1,854 farms in 1997, down 7 percent.

Land in farms

239,740 acres in 2002, 236,346 acres in 1997, up 1 percent.

Average size of farm

138 acres in 2002, 127 acres in 1997, up 9 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$35,898,000 in 2002, \$40,418,000 in 1997, down 11 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$18,362,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$17,536,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$20,726 in 2002, \$21,801 in 1997, down 5 percent.


Government Payments
