

Hart, Kentucky

Number of farms

1,392 farms in 2002, 1,450 farms in 1997, down 4 percent.

Land in farms

194,676 acres in 2002, 188,523 acres in 1997, up 3 percent.

Average size of farm

140 acres in 2002, 130 acres in 1997, up 8 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$29,778,000 in 2002, \$34,612,000 in 1997, down 14 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$10,501,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$19,277,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$21,392 in 2002, \$23,870 in 1997, down 10 percent.


Government Payments
