


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**



## Henderson, Kentucky

#### **Number of farms**

525 farms in 2002, 600 farms in 1997, down 13 percent.

#### Land in farms

192,264 acres in 2002, 207,453 acres in 1997, down 7 percent.

### Average size of farm

366 acres in 2002, 346 acres in 1997, up 6 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$51,896,000 in 2002, \$52,110,000 in 1997, down slightly. Crop sales accounted for \$28,956,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$22,940,000 of the total value in 2002.

### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$98,849 in 2002, \$86,850 in 1997, up 14 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
