

Henry, Kentucky

Number of farms

883 farms in 2002, 1,022 farms in 1997, down 14 percent.

Land in farms

141,592 acres in 2002, 150,585 acres in 1997, down 6 percent.

Average size of farm

160 acres in 2002, 147 acres in 1997, up 9 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$25,637,000 in 2002, \$36,830,000 in 1997, down 30 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$14,567,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$11,070,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$29,034 in 2002, \$36,037 in 1997, down 19 percent.


Government Payments
