


# **2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile**



## Jackson, Kentucky

#### **Number of farms**

727 farms in 2002, 756 farms in 1997, down 4 percent.

#### Land in farms

82,215 acres in 2002, 77,268 acres in 1997, up 6 percent.

#### Average size of farm

113 acres in 2002, 102 acres in 1997, up 11 percent.

#### **Market Value of Production**

\$7,899,000 in 2002, \$9,993,000 in 1997, down 21 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$4,430,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$3,469,000 of the total value in 2002.

#### Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$10,866 in 2002, \$13,218 in 1997, down 18 percent.


#### **Government Payments**
