


2002 Census of Agriculture County Profile



Jefferson, Kentucky

Number of farms

526 farms in 2002, 565 farms in 1997, down 7 percent.

Land in farms

41,061 acres in 2002, 39,128 acres in 1997, up 5 percent.

Average size of farm

78 acres in 2002, 69 acres in 1997, up 13 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$13,328,000 in 2002, \$14,260,000 in 1997, down 7 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$9,938,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$3,390,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$25,338 in 2002, \$25,239 in 1997, up slightly.


Government Payments
