

23,830 acres in 2002, 22,908 acres in 1997, up 4 percent.

Average size of farm

122 acres in 2002, 111 acres in 1997, up 10 percent.

Market Value of Production

\$1,231,000 in 2002, \$1,351,000 in 1997, down 9 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$1,000,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$231,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm


\$6,311 in 2002, \$6,527 in 1997, down 3 percent.


Government Payments
