

Market Value of Production

\$216,000 in 2002, \$143,000 in 1997, up 51 percent. Crop sales accounted for \$60,000 of the total value in 2002. Livestock sales accounted for \$155,000 of the total value in 2002.

Market Value of Production, average per farm




